Fr. Molloy To Speak At Red Mass

The Rev. Edward A. Molloy, C.S.S.R., widely known as a missionary and retreat master will deliver the sermon at the Ninth Annual Lawyers Red Mass in St. Joseph's Church, Thursday, Sept. 17 at 9 a.m.

The traditional Mass marking the opening of the Courts of Justice in the Rochester area will be celebrated by His Excellency Bishop Kearney who inaugurated the custom, nine years ago.

BORN IN Boston, Father Molloy served as a chaplain in the United States Army from 1942 to 1946. He spent three of those years in the Pacific Theater and was separated from the service with the rank of Lieutenant Colonel.

The noted Redemptorist was ordained in 1932 after studying at St. Mary's College in Pennsylvania and Mount St. Alphonsus, Esopus. Before World War 2 he covered the eastern part of the United States as a missionary and retreat master.

He is now attached to the Notre Dame Retreat House, 246 Alexander St., Rochester, where he has conducted many retreats. He has also appeared before the First Friday Luncheon Club.
