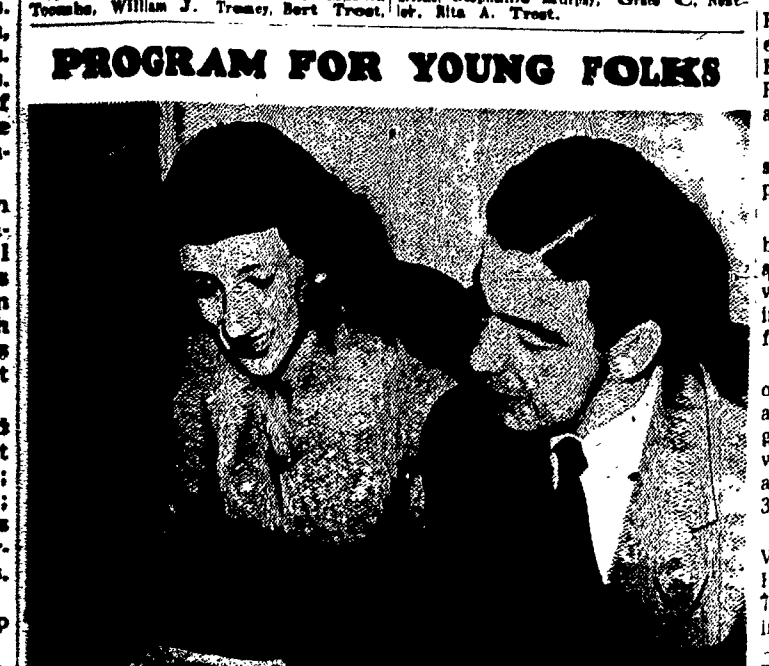
Cathedral Rosary Guild To Open First Membership Campaign With Goal Of 1200
