All members of the Franciscan Order are especially interested this year in the 700th anniversary of the death of St. Clare of Assisi which was celebrated on Aug. 12.

The reliquary containing her body was displayed in San Damiano, her own first monastery, and the ceremonies were broadcast to the world on Aug. 11.

The magnificent reliquary was carried from its permanent shrine at Santa Chiara on a pilgrimage to the basilica of St. Mary of the Angels, called the Portiuncula, and to the famous basilica of San Francesco of Assisi, then back to Santa Chiara for a solemn novena.

Franciscan nuns all over the world celebrated the septuagesimary, and a national congress of Franciscan Tertiaries added solemnity to the ceremonies in Assisi which honored the great founder of the Second Order of St. Francis.
