400 Set For Enrollment In Eucharistic League

In the initial campaign for membership in The People's Eucharistic League, just established in Holy Family Parish, Rochester, more than 400 parishioners have applied for enrollment.

On September 28 at 7:45 p.m., His Excellency Bishop Kearney, in an impressive Reception Ceremony before the Blessed Sacrament enthroned on the altar, will enroll 392 of these applicants. The remainder of those who have already applied for membership will be received at ceremonies to be held regularly later on.

Priests of the parish and members of the local unit, called The Marianite Eucharistic League and dedicated to Our Lady of the Most Blessed Sacrament, have been deeply gratified by the overwhelming response of their people to this plea for an hour's adoration each month before the Blessed Sacrament, they said.

EACH OF these prospective members have been personally contacted by the charter members of the League, who made their Act of Consecration to the Holy Eucharistic last June. Following the Reception Ceremony on Sept. 28, the new members will assemble in the Auditorium of the school, where a business meeting will be held. The Society is dedicated to the furtherance of Eucharistic Devotions and projects in every aspect, although the members are not obliged to attend the business meetings and participate in the other projects.

The sole requirements for membership are the enrollment and the serious promise to spend at least one hour each month in adoration of the Blessed Sacrament.

The organization will continue to sponsor its regular Mission projects, particularly in favor of the work of The Rev. Charles Erb, S.V.D., a missionary of the Society of the Divine Word, Gold Coast, Africa. Father Erb, originally from Holy Family Parish, had been the recipient of this Society's mission funds for the past two years.

Ceremony Accepts Toronto Man As Benedictine Novice

Mr. James Durkin Pape, son of Mr. and Mrs. Augustine Pape of 27 Inglewood Drive, Toronto, Ontario, and a former member of Our Lady of Perpetual Help Parish, Toronto, was received as a Benedictine

Novice on September 7, following the First Vespers of the Feast of the Nativity of Our Lady. The ceremony took place in the recently dedicated octagonal chapel of Mount Saviour Monastery, Elmira. Mr. Pape was given the name "Brother Luke."

BROTHER LUKE had previously spent some months at Mount Saviour as a Candidate and then in the status of a Postulant. During the period of his candidacy he assisted in the organization of a shop for the sale of religious articles and liturgical art, including imports from several European countries and monasteries.

He will now spend some months in the novitiate at St. Benoit-du-Lac and then return to Mount Saviour.

Previous to entering this monastery, Mr. Pape spent some years with T. Eaton Company, College Street, Toronto, in the interior decorating department. For a short time he was Secretary-Treasurer of the Interior Decorators Society of Ontario and was also for some years a Director of the Canadian Ballet Festival Association. He served in the Canadian Army Medical Corps with the No. 3 Canadian General Hospital for three and one-half years.

MOUNT SAVIOUR Monastery was established in the spring of 1951 and is directly under the jurisdiction of the Abbot Primate of the Benedictines.

The community which started with four novices, 16, including the novices who are trained at the Abbey of St. Benoit-du-Lac, near Magog, in the Province of Quebec.

The life of the monks is devoted to the chanting of the Divine Office and Daily High Mass, work on the farm, the reception of visitors and retreatants. The monks have a truck garden and small dairy herd for their own use and have started to raise beef cattle from which it is hoped to obtain income for the support of the community.
