Bishop Reads Mass To Mark Opening Of Courts Of Law

The Mass was offered to ask God's blessings on the courts of justice as they reopen for the fall term.

Father Molloy of the Notre Dame Retreat House commended the members of the bar for their prayerful intent.

THE PRESENT age the speaker explained, brings to the fore false prophets and false conceptions.

"There are no isolated compartments of morality; man is totally moral, or he is completely immoral."

"Present influence and popular pressure tempt an innocuous solution to you professional men today," he continued.

"Call it the ebb tide of morality from the shores of three wars in one generation; call it the sophistic labyrinth of relativism; call it the two-faced Janus of Secularism; call it the paralyzing apathy of Postivism or Existentialism; call it a combination of all these; but woven through the fabric of American life today is their envenomed effect; the doctrine and practice of a double standard of morality; the cry that it makes no difference what a man is in his private life; the fallacy that a man can have one code of morality personally; another code as a public servant."

IN COMMENDING the manifestation of the Red Mass, the Redemptorist Father said.

"If each field of endeavor is virtuous — the national is virtuous; and each man yields untold influence in his sphere to assure the Sovereignty of God — the Primacy of the Spiritual — and the consequence of both — sacredness of law.

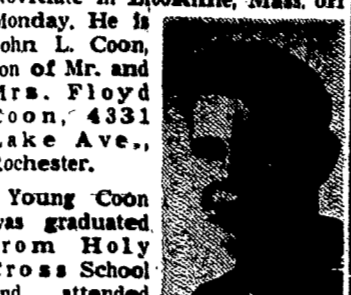
"Where it is the code of the Babylonian Hammurabi or the Emperor Justinian — the Charter of the Magna Carta — the Constitution of the United States and the United Nations, the purpose of all law is man's own happiness and the source of all human positive law is God.

"Deny that fact and the sanction of any law is force; ignore the truth that all true law is an expression of the Will of God and Absolutism reigns and Tyranny is king."

Adoration On First Friday Set In Holy Family Parish

His Excellency Bishop Kearney on Monday, Sept. 28 at 7:45 p.m. during the Pontifical Ceremony for the Reception of new members into the Marianite Eucharistic League will formally establish in Holy Family Parish, the Confraternity of the Most Blessed Sacrament.

All enrolled members will thereby also be admitted to the privileges and indulgences of this Papal Confraternity.

The Bishop will, at the same time, officially designate the First Friday of each month as "Adoration Day" at Holy Family. The Blessed Sacrament will be exposed in that Church every First Friday, beginning Oct. 2, from 8:45 a.m. until the same time at night. A public Holy Hour will close the day of Exposition at 7:45 p.m. each month.

During the Ceremony the Bishop will lead candidates in their Act of Consecration to Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament and present each new member with their Eucharistic Medal, Diploma and Statute Book. The sermon will be preached by the Bishop, at the end of the Services, which take place with the Blessed Sacrament solemnly enthroned on the altar.

MAEN OBJECT of the Act of Consecration is the strict promise of the Candidate to spend at least one hour each month in adoration of the Blessed Sacrament, preferably, although not necessarily, in his own parish Church. This is the only obligation of membership in the People's Eucharistic League. However, members are urged to attend the business meetings on the last Monday of each month and participate in the other Eucharistic projects sponsored by the Society. Each monthly meeting will be preceded by a private Reception ceremony for new members in Church at 7:45 p.m.

Although it is not necessary that members make their monthly tour of Adoration at public services or at any specified time, the Holy Family people are being urged to avail themselves of the special privilege of Exposition on the First Fridays and fulfill their obligation then. It is particularly suggested that they come in family or neighborhood groups.

Applications will continue to be accepted, but the Officers of the Society note that membership in this local center is restricted, according to the Constitution, to Holy Family parishioners beyond grammar school age. The present Council consists of Ruth Friday, Theolma Radet, Dorothy Uhl, Joseph Snyder, Joseph O'Connor and Teresa Hannan.
