Bishop Kearney To Dedicate New School For Mother Of Sorrows Parish In Greece

Dedication of the impressive, modern and adequate new two-story building of Mother of Sorrows School by His Excellency Bishop Kearney will take place on Sunday, Oct. 11 at 4 p.m. according to the Rev. Daniel B. O'Rourke, pastor.

The school building on Latta Road replacing the one on Mt. Read Blvd. will be open for inspection by the public on Saturday, Sunday and Monday. Monday will be dedicated to executives and principals of parochial and public schools in the area.

THE NEW SCHOOL is staffed by Sisters of St. Joseph and lay teachers. Sister Jane Joseph is principal.

Grade teachers are: Eighth grade, Sister Jane Joseph; Seventh, Sister Mary Caroline; Sixth, Miss Sheila Hogan; Fifth, Sister Mary Alacoque; fourth, Sister Mary Depazzi; third, Miss Marguerite McShea; second, Sister Jeanne Agnes and Miss Marilyn Gizzie; first, Sister Frances Camilla; kindergarten, Miss Sheila Hickey; music department, Sister Ellen Louise and Miss Sheila Hickey.

Another feature in the new structure is a guidance room where pupils can go frequently to obtain counsel from the Rev. Andrew S. Teuschel, assistant pastor, who is in charge.

FATHER O'ROURKE said this room might be called a vocation room where literature and pictures help the children in "youth's long thoughts of the future."

"For this room," the pastor said, "we have to thank Miss Mary Sheehan, principal of Monroe High School who showed us the value of such a center to pupils of all ages in their religious and social aspirations."

In addition to instructions for the children, the Audio-Visual Room is used for Cane conferences for young couples of the parish.

Mother of Sorrows School was started under Father O'Rourke's direction in 1946 in a house be-
