The children in "The Living Rosary" were under the supervision of Sister M. Joanna, eighth grade teacher.

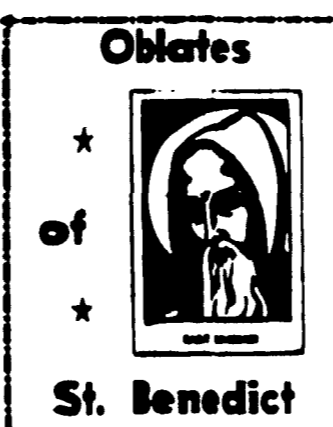
