Rochester Priest Named Chaplain

The Rev. Nicholas F. Mosier, C.S.V., a native of Rochester, is now Catholic Chaplain for Mangano State Hospital where he was transferred from Manrocks, N. Y., where he had been doing parish work during the summer months.

Father Mosier attended St. Ambrose College in Davenport, Iowa, and made his clerical studies at Catholic University of America in Washington. He was ordained in February, 1948, at the Shrine of the Immaculate Conception in Washington, D. C.

This is not the first time Father Mosier has cared for the Catholic chaplain's work at Mangano State, having been here the summer after Father F. J. Wenthe had been transferred. Even before that and while still a brother, he assisted Father Corbin, then chaplain at the hospital.

Father Mosier taught at St. Gregory's high school in Chicago and for the past four years has taught in the Archbishop Stepien high school in White Plains, N. Y. His early interest in Mangano State remained with him and he said he was very happy to be back.

Trieste Bishop Charges Persecution

Trieste (RNS) Bishop Amleto Santin of Trieste told the Italian press that oppression was "horrible and inhuman" in Yugoslavia-occupied Zone B.

Pilgrims Attend Mass In Cave

Edinburgh, Scotland—(NC)—cave where the first Bishop of Mass in an ancient monastic lived 1,600 years ago.

The Mass was the climax of a pilgrimage in honor of St. Ninian, Bishop of Galloway, led by Bishop Joseph McGee, the present head of the See. The cave is high among the rocks at Whithorn in Wigtonshire.

Through the mile-long Physgill Glen, the Bishop and his party walked on foot to the open seashore and then across the long pebbled beach to the cave. At some points, the pilgrims had to wade ankle deep in mud.

At an altar erected inside the cave, Bishop McGee offered the first Mass to be celebrated there with a noise of the waves as his accompaniment. The intention of the pilgrimage was the conversion of Scotland.
