

Seton Branches, Aides To Hear Bishop At Breakfast

Members of the Seton Branches and Volunteer Aides of St. Mary's Hospital will hold their fifth annual Communion Breakfast on Sunday, Oct. 18 in the Hospital Auditorium. This will be preceded by Mass at 8 o'clock in the Old Chapel. His Excellency Bishop Kearney will celebrate the Mass and will address the members.

Guests at the breakfast will include Dr. Leo F. LaPalm, Chief of Staff at St. Mary's; Dr. John Butler, Director of Medical Education; Daniel E. Macken, Chairman of the Men's Board; and Mrs. Gordon Reitz, Chairman of the Women's Board.

SETON WORKERS were organized in 1905 and named for Mother Seton, foundress of the Daughters of Charity of St. Vincent de Paul, the community of Sisters which staffs St. Mary's. The group has grown from six to 28 branches, three of which have been formed the past year under the chairmanship of Mrs. Robert Howe, Mrs. Frank Freck, and Mrs. Frederick Martin.

One of the outstanding projects of the Seton branches is the sponsoring of scholarships for student nurses at St. Mary's. At the present time four young

women are receiving their training through this charitable aid. Members also perform a variety of tasks for the hospital, including stretching and folding gauze for medical dressings, making articles for the Gift Shop, filling Christmas stockings and preparing gifts for the Children's Ward and the Clinic, staffing and purchasing books for the Patients' library.

National Magazine Tells Of 'Father Lane's Gang'

National recognition of "Father Lane's Gang" and of the priest responsible for it is given in a featured article of the Oct. 17th issue of The Saturday Evening Post, out this week.

The priest who started it and was given recognition for his work as chaplain of Elmira Reformatory when Pope Pius XII made him a Domestic Prelate with the title of Right Reverend Monsignor is the Rt. Rev. Msgr. Francis J. Lane whose home was in Rochester.

Another of the articles which is adequately illustrated especially with a half-page photo of Monsignor Lane in his office, is John Galfinfort of whom the Post says:

"Galfinfort agrees that justice may have to fasten a man's crime on him; as the saying goes. But his special esteem is for people who unfasten a man from his crime, and show him how to be free."

DEMONSTRATING his esteem Author Galfinfort in detail and in a convincing manner tells of "Father Lane's" work with young men formerly in his charge as inmates of the Reformatory and now out in the world. The "Gang" is comprised of the inmates who when in Elmira Reformatory worked in Monsignor Lane's office and came under his influence. The Post article says the Gang is non-norminal; its members and its work include men of all faiths.

Without money, only interest in parolees, the article tells how Gang members go into the parolees' homes shortly after the men are released, give them companionship and counsel and try in the manner of Alcoholics Anonymous to keep them straight.

How Monsignor Lane conceived the idea, his background as a chaplain, how he has developed the Gang and how he meets with them periodically especially at a celebrity attended banquet in New York City are brought out in the Post article.

The writer of the Post piece tells how the Gang gets to the men while still in prison and works unceasingly to "make them feel wanted when they come out" -- the best way to keep them from going back to prison.

He leaves his wife Sarah, a son, Robert; a daughter, Nancy; a brother, Edward S., lieutenant in the Rochester Fire Bureau; a sister, Mrs. Leon E. Coy of Brighton and three grandchildren.

Burial was in Holy Sepulchre Cemetery where the final blessing was imparted by the Rt. Rev. William M. Hart, D.D., V.G.; Fathers Willis Whalen, Wood, Maxwell and Lawrence Ward.
