Child's Life Foundation Laid In Home, Says Priest

Geneva — It is in the home and not the school that the early foundation for a child's life is laid, the Rev. Vincent P. Collins, of St. Theodore's parish, Rochester, told the Rosary Society of St. Francis de Sales parish.

More attention should be paid to home life, Father Collins emphasized. The speaker, former assistant at St. Francis de Sales parish and moderator of the Rosary Society, addressed 100 members at the annual banquet in Geneva Country Club.

Miss Edith Charchia was toastmistress. Mrs. Jay Cochran, president, presided at the dinner. The present moderator, the Rev. John F. Loughlin, spoke briefly. Father Collins dwelt particularly on the life of the Little Flower, St. Therese of the Child Jesus, whose story is widely known throughout the world. He emphasized her early life and environment probably had much to do with her becoming a Saint of the church. She was born in 1873 in France and "lived in what might be called our own time, and we should feel very close to her".

PARALLELING the theme of the guest speaker, Mrs. Thomas A. Kane, a prominent member of the Society, gave an inspirational talk on the need for more care and attention of the very young children. She particularly advised young mothers to be careful of the reading matter which comes into the hands of their youngsters. She expressed the belief that much of the delinquency of the present day can be traced to reading material unfit for children.
