Legion Leader Lauds Pastor's Stand On Union

Action of the Rev. Marg Michael J. Kreig, pastor of the Church of the Nativity, E.W.M. in warring against "the Communist party-line dominated United Electrical Workers Union" trying to organize in the General Electric plant in Brockport was commended in the October Orleans County Legionnaire, received this week.

Prior to the election in which the U.E. attempted to win bargaining rights at the Brockport plant, Monsignor Kreig "sounded the alarm," in a sermon in his church. The American Legion answered the call.

The Union which had been expelled from the C.I.O. was defeated. Of the plant's 256 production and maintenance employees, 144 voted for no union, 70 voted for U.E. and 42 voted for the International Union of Electrical Workers (I.U.), an 11th hour arrival on the ballot.

Monsignor Kreig's role in the defeat was lauded by William H. Murray, Americanism Chairman of Orleans County in an article entitled "County Americanism At Work."
