Donations of modern Catholic literature will be gratefully received, according to club officials. Such donations may be turned over to the librarians at any regular meeting of the three sponsoring groups.

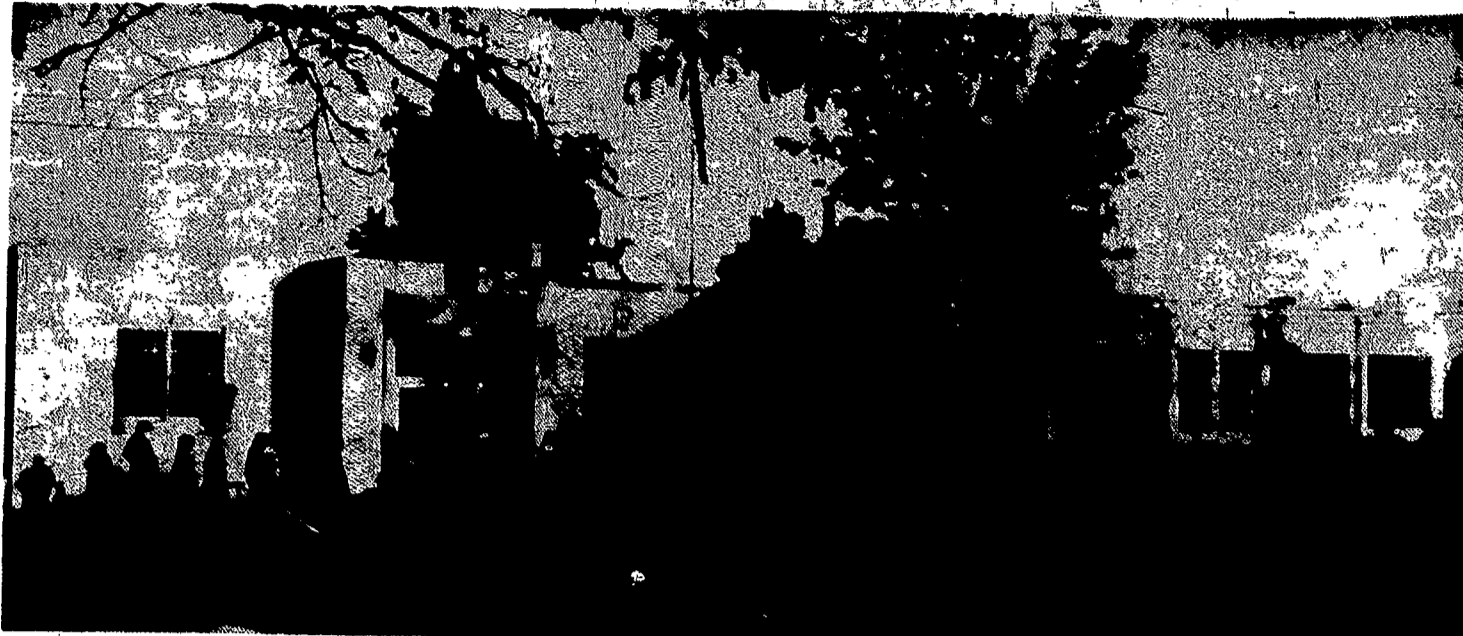
Auxiliary 126 Staff Installation Listed

5 Student Assistantships Offered By Catholic U.

Five student assistantships in the Office of the Dean of Women, Catholic University of America are available according to Mary Elinor Smith, dean of women.

These assistantships are for women interested in counseling and student personnel work. Considerable responsibility is said to be attached to these positions and it is essential that an applicant have several years experience in teaching, social case work or clinical psychology.

UNDER THIS plan a person may work toward a graduate degree, Master's or Doctorate, in the departments of Education, Nursing Education or Psychology.

As an assistant he is allowed to carry only part-time work, a minimum of two years is necessary to complete the requirements for a Master's degree. An assistant receives board room and part-time tuition for the two year period. Duties of this assistantship are varied, covering several areas of student life.

In addition to the above assistantships, two board and room scholarships are available for resident undergraduates. Preference would be given to students pursuing a graduate course, though under some circumstances those working toward a bachelor's degree would be accepted.
