Marian Year Objective Set By Notre Dame Alumni

The 16th Annual Notre Dame Communion Sunday, which will be observed by thousands of alumni from coast-to-coast on Dec. 6, will be dedicated to the success of the forthcoming Marian Year recently proclaimed by Pope Plus XII. The board of directors of the Notre Dame Alumni Association has requested 140 alumni clubs throughout the world, as well as individual alumni outside these areas, to devote this Sunday nearest the Feast of the Immaculate Conception to the success of the centenary observance of the dogma which was defined in 1854. "Because Notre Dame is the largest school in the United States dedicated to Our Lady, and because Pope Plus XII himself is an honorary alumnus as the result of the degree conferred on his visit to the campus in 1936, the alumni board feels that Notre Dame men have both an obligation and a privilege to promote the Marian Year," James E. Armstrong, executive secretary of the Notre Dame Alumni Association declared. THE NOTRE DAME clubs' annual observance was inaugurated in 1938 because of the need for stressing the close ties between religion and American citizenship, beautifully symbolized in the dedication of the United States to Our Lady in her Immaculate Conception by the American hierarchy more than one hundred years ago. Club observance will center around attendance at Mass and Communion breakfasts with speakers from Notre Dame or the local area stressing the history and nature of the dogma of the Immaculate Conception to be commemorated during 1964. The dance will be held in the Parish Hall, Coldwater Road on Friday, Nov. 20 and will include round and square dance music provided by Earles Orchestra. Bill Swain is the caller and dancing will be from 9 to 1. Refreshments will be available. The committee headed by Mr. and Mrs. John R. Riedman invites the general public.

Canisius Grad Named Director Public Library

A graduate of Canisius High School and also Canisius College in 1937, Harold S. Hacker, the new director of Rochester Public Library comes from Buffalo. Hacker, 37 is currently head of the Grosvenor Library in Buffalo and will take over his duties here on Jan. 1. Appointment of Hacker to the Rochester Public Library post which also includes directorship of the Monroe County Library system is one, was announced by Dr. Wilbur Eddy Saunders and Frank Traynor, presidents of the city and county library boards respectively. THE NEW director was selected by a committee headed by Mrs. Arthur J. May and including Mrs. Floyd B. Newell and George F. Helberg. Hacker served at Grosvenor Library, Buffalo Public Library and Erie County Public Library a variety of posts since 1941. He is described as "highly qualified, having had considerable experience in both city and county library setups, and having worked in every section of library operation." He is also a graduate of the University of Buffalo Library School in 1941. As director of Grosvenor since May, 1952, he has been in charge of a reference and research library similar in scope and function to those of the main building of the New York Public Library. He was one of four librarians appointed by Governor Dewey in 1949 to the governor's 15-man Library Aid Committee that was assigned the task of formulating a state-aid program for libraries.

Mercy Mission Day Lists Former Prisoner Of Reds

The visit of a Maryknoll missionary just freed from Communist imprisonment in China and a sparkling song-and-dance comedy of college life headline Mercy High School's Mission Day plans for Friday, Nov. 20. Miss Julie Langie, CSMC president inviting alumnae, parents and friends to attend the full day program at the Blossom Road School, announced today that the Rev. Robert W. Greene, M.M., author of the current, much-discussed "Calvary in China", who endured nearly two years of torture and jail under Red rule, will address the student assembly at noon on his experiences in the Chinese persecution. Following the talk, and repeated again at 8 p.m. sharp, a student cast of 50 will present "Cupid on Campus", a two-act musical comedy-revue. Music and lyrics for all the show tunes have been prepared by Sylvia Novelli and Sylvia Dee and the Novelli Orchestra will play for both performances. MISS DEE, professionally famous for such hit songs as "Too Young", "Chickery-Chick", and "Lili Bolero", collaborated with Mr. Novelli, popular Rochester orchestra leader, several years ago on a group of songs which the Mercy girls have chosen for their show. Never before used for public performance, the songs have provided the theme for the college-life script written by Sister Mary Pius of the Mercy faculty. "Cupid on Campus" will have Mr. Novelli at the piano directing his orchestra for the entire score. Special choral arrangements for the Glee Club members in the show were made by Miss Sue Wigg, director of The Mercy choir heard on WHEC. FEATURED SOLOISTS will be De Anne Volkman, Barbara Kern, Alice O'Brien and Marjorie Merkle. Dance solos will be presented by Elvira De Yullo, Barbara McKenna, Eileen Haefner, Adelina Marino and Carmela Agnello. Principal speaking roles will be handled by Patricia Gargan, Patricia Hickey, Lucy Blackwood, Shiela Stampfli, Kathy Shea and Joan Swartale. The Mercy Gym, transformed into a gala bazaar, will be taking in money for home and foreign mission support between 1:30 and 5 in the afternoon and from 7 to 11 in the evening.
