NOTING THE moral confusion and spiritual needs of the times, a priest, minister and rabbi explored the factors which impeded the provision of substantial religious education for millions of American youth.
The Very Rev. Paul C. Reinert, S.J., president of St. Louis University, the Rev. Dr. Henry Pitney Van Dusen, president of the Union Theological Seminary, New York and Dr. Abba Hillel Silver, rabbi of Congregation Tifereth Israel, Cleveland, considered fundamental causes of the failure to provide adequate religious education and the effect of this failure on the nation's character and way of life.
Bishop Edwin V. O'Hara of Kansas City and chairman of the National Committee of the Confederation of Christian Doctrine, appraised the various means whereby religious education is being provided.
Concerned with making such education available to all children and youth, regardless of their faith, he discussed "released time," the inclusion of religious matter in public schools, and Sunday school programs.
THE SEMINAR in which Sister Joseph Mary participated met four times during the convention, which marked the golden anniversary of the association. Her group worked on formulations of educational objectives and principles based on religious presuppositions. Sister Joseph Mary is a recognized authority on the philosophy of education.
