**Middle States Association  
Accredits LeMoyn College**

Syracuse — The Very Rev. William J. Schlaerth, S.J., President of Le Moyn College, announced today that the Middle States Association's Commission on Higher Education had fully accredited Le Moyn College.

Dr. E. Kenneth Smiley, chairman of the Middle States Association's Commission on Institutions of Higher Education sent the official word that Le Moyn had been accredited and had been made a member of the Middle States Association of Colleges and Secondary Schools. His congratulations on the good work done by the college were extended to the president, the faculty, and to the students.

"THIS ACTION now means that Le Moyn has been accepted into the family of the country's leading educational institutions," said Father Schlaerth. "And this shows," he continued, "that the Association has recognized the strength of the program here at Le Moyn."

"The accreditation is important to the students because it means that they will have transfer-of-credit privileges with other colleges and universities which are usually not granted to non-accredited schools. Le Moyn students now can stand shoulder to shoulder with the students of the best schools in the country."

In the late Spring of this year, 1953, an accrediting team appointed by the Middle States Association visited the campus and examined the equipment, facilities, course requirements for admission, and programs of students. The members of the committee visited classrooms and inspected the library facilities. It was on the basis of their findings that the accreditation was granted.

**Eskimos Honest, Jesuit  
Tells Geneva Nurse Unit**

Stealing is unknown among the Eskimos the Rev. Edmund Anable, S.J., told an audience of nearly 200 Monday in the Sales High School Auditorium.

"They have no locks, do not try to hide articles away, because no one would take a thing without asking," he said.

Father Anable, a well-known authority on Alaska, gave an illustrated lecture on "Life With The Eskimos" under the sponsorship of the Geneva nurse unit, Catholic Nurses, Miss Marlon S. Whelan was program chairman.

**50th Anniversary  
Marked By Firm**

Special recognition was given to general agents Oakley and McNamee, Genesee Valley Trust Building by General Accident and Potomac Insurance Companies on the local firm's 50th anniversary.

Thomas McNamee, associated with F. W. Oakley, is president of St. Rita's Holy Name Society in West Weoster and captained a team of workers in the Bishop's Jubilee High School Drive.

INTRODUCED by the Rev. John V. Loughlin of St. Francis deSales parish, moderator of the unit, Father Anable gave an interesting commentary and showed beautiful colored films on Alaska.

There are about 30,000 Eskimos in the world, Father Anable said, and 20,000 of these are in America. He noted also that about ninety percent of the literature written on Alaska is incorrect.

Fishing is the main industry and plenty of northern pike, trout and other fish are caught. Salmon is found in the Yukon river. By means of a homemade wheel, the Eskimo often catches 5,000 to 6,000 salmon in 21 hours.

The Eskimo has a short work day because it becomes dark at 2 p.m. Notorious for conserving their energy, the Eskimo uses dogs to haul home his catches.

EVERYONE HELPS during the salmon run, Father Anable said, from the oldest nun in the mission school to the youngest child. He showed pictures of the Sisters of St. Ann cleaning fish and working with the youngsters of the mission.

King Island in Alaska is an interesting community. It is a small group of huts huddled against the side of sheer rock. All of the inhabitants are Catholic. It bears a large bronze statue of Christ the King which was hauled up hundreds of feet of close rock, and placed strategically on a high cliff overlooking the village. The statue was brought to the island by the famed Glacier priest, the Rev. Bernard Hubbard, S. J.
