Spoiled Child

"Methinks, my thane, thy face is as a book where men may read strange matters."

These words spoken by a character in one of Shakespeare's plays are directed to an adult, but they are equally applicable to children, even to the pre-school child. And of the many matters which may be read in the face of a child, the one most observers abhor is the expression which denotes the spoiled child.

"When we use the expression 'That child is spoiled' we are postulating grammatically a truth sometimes overlooked. If a child has been spoiled, the passive voice of the verb reminds us, someone spoiled it.

Psychologists tell us that there are many motives that underlie the spoiling of a child. Very frequently it is an expression of blind selfishness seeing in the child an extension of one's self.

and vicariously enjoying the sense of satisfaction or superiority which the spoiled child feels when occasionally he is satisfied.

OFTEN WHEN there is discord between parents each parent subconsciously perhaps, tries to gain primary in the child's love and sympathy by deliberately attempting to buy the child's favor with the purpose of hurting the other parent.

Such a situation is horrible to consider, of course, but truth compels most of us to admit that we can list by name and address at least one example of this very sort of thing.

The attitudes and viewpoint of the spoiled child are not something that can be broken off like a length of thread at a given point but rather they become part of the warp and woof of the total makeup of the individual we label personally.

AND SO THE parent who spoils a child or permits anyone else to spoil his child is building a memorial to his own carelessness, selfishness or ego.

How often when the reason for an unhappy marriage is asked, the answer is "Well, she (or he) was always spoiled." So the child we spoil today may very easily become the unhappily married man or woman of tomorrow.

To end as we start with a quotation from Shakespeare, it is not only "the good that men do lives after them," but unfortunately often the evil does also. As parents we should strive earnestly to bring up our children to be well integrated, happily adjusted individuals with the sense of their importance to God alone.

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WHAT'S DOING AT THE DALYS' In The Stew

It all started so simply... The McCambridges are having kidney stew for dinner. Markle announced at our own mealtalk dinner. "Sure smelled good." "That's the head of the House took up. "Nice and brown?" "Thick gravy?" "U-h-h-h." Markle nodded. Potatoes too and mushrooms.

"Sunday morning's the time to have it, though," the Head of House went on. "And I'll bet your mother'd fix us one for next Sunday breakfast if we'd ask her. She can cook anything!" The last sentence was my undoing—uttered as I was about to protest that I knew less than nothing about cooking kidneys.

So, onto the week-end market list went "kidneys." "What kind you want, lady?" the butcher inquired. "Lamb, beef or veal?" "Kidney-stew kidneys," I answered meekly. "Enough for seven."

BEEF, IT SEEMS, is the desired kind. What to do with them was the next problem solved up to a point, by consultation with five cook books. All agreed that you soak the bloody things for an hour. After that, there were five different versions. One would have you simmer them till evening, taking at least two hours to come to bubble.

Well, keeping a watched pot from boiling is not an ideal way of preparing a Saturday. So I pored over the other books, looking for the most streamlined way of achieving a Sunday-morning kidney stew. "Drop into boiling unsalted water," said the lazy man's cookbook. "Simmer until tender. Remove from stock. Cool. Place in covered stock in refrigerator, reserving stock. When chilled cut away fat and membrane. Cut into wafer-thin slices."

REMOVE FAT from stock and add 1 bay leaf, a few drops of brown coloring (smart book, the others recommended dipping each of those wafer-thin slices in flour and browning)... Simmer gently until reduced to 1 cup. It seems you saute the soaked kidneys, stir in flour in the usual way, add potatoes or whatever, add stock and there you are. Nothing to it!

By Saturday night I'd got to the simmering down stage... Going downstairs a bit ahead of the 8 o'clock Mass goes. I started the stock simmering. Then City couldn't find her hat: the Head of the House couldn't locate this week's church envelope: so, in the tizz of being the lost-and-found department, I dashed off to Mass. Had I turned off the gas?

BY THE TIME of the Gloria, I knew that Mass was doing no good to one particular member of the congregation. So I drove home to find the stew.
