Nazareth College Thespians Bill 'Madwoman Of Chailot'

Eileen Flanagan will appear in the title role when the Nazareth College players present "The Madwoman of Chailot" in the college auditorium, 4245 East Ave., Thursday and Friday evenings, Nov. 19 and 20. Curtain time is 8:15.

Described by critics as a satirical fantasy, comedy or fable, the play enjoyed a two-year run on Broadway. Jean Giraudoux is the author.

The intricate plot centers about the Countess Aurelia, an elderly eccentric who lives in a world of illusion, devoting herself to the care of pigeons, stray dogs, flowers and an assortment of odd characters.

When she is confronted with reality and learns that the world has changed for the worse since her withdrawal from it, she decides to cleanse society of its wickedness.

The MADWOMAN of Chailot (Chailot is one of the most fashionable sections of Paris where the action takes place) enlists the aid of three other eccentricities: the madwoman of Passy, played by Mary Ellen Frasher; the madwoman of St. Sulpice, Joan Eseltine; and the madwoman of La Concorde, Dorothy Smith. When the action ends, the audience is left wondering whether the noble woman of Chailot is really mad after all.

Supporting Miss Flanagan are Jack Rogers, Joseph Rausch, Jack Wheeler, Norbert McBride, Joan Day, Barbara Goddard, Carol Sanderson, Jose Echaniz, David Brown, John Maier, Louis Maglio, John Trevason and Walter Kolesnik.

CATHOLIC THEATRE members also in the cast are: Robert Brice, Carl Zollo, Lloyd Hubbard, Wilford Scott, Abe Cook and Robert Smett.

Miss Jean Strachan, instructor in the Nazareth College department of speech and drama, is director. Costumes are by Anna May Waytowich, set designs by Nancy Wagner, make-up by Jean McCormack and publicity by Louise Conerton.

Miss Flanagan, the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Peter V. Flanagan, 178 Inglewood Dr., is a senior in the woman's college where she is majoring in speech. She was author and director of last spring's S.R.O. musical comedy production "Pan-demonium."

A graduate of Nazareth Academy, she is active in the National Federation of Catholic College Students. She is currently practicing-teaching speech at East High School.

State Fair' Chorus Rehearses At Holy Family

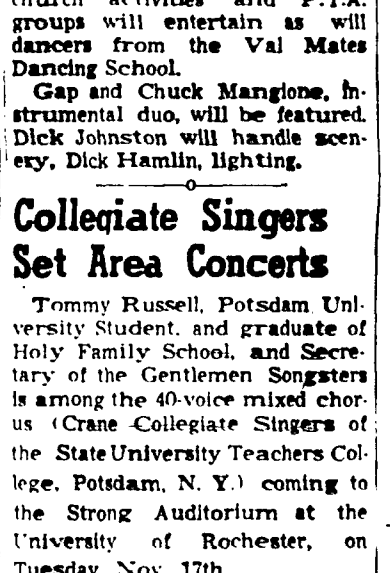

THURSDAY SKETCH OF PATRICIA MORISON

Born New York, 1919. Father, William R. Morrison, raised in England and mother (maiden name Carson), raised in Ireland; both Protestant, Baptized as a child and raised nominally an Episcopalian.

Attended public school, New York. Often visited St. Patrick's Cathedral, "feeling half guilty of intrusion."

Once lit candle near statue of the Little Flower "without knowing what it meant." Later discovered a special devotion to St. Theresa through a young doctor friend, Dr. Nadim Slim, in Mexico, a country she loved. He gave her a relic which lost at Madison Square Gardens during an all-star USO rally, and found by Bob Hope, led to an introduction which resulted in her auditioning for star role in "Kiss Me, Kate."

Broadway triumph in "Kate" eclipsed her well established success as singer and movie star in twenty-odd major Hollywood films.

ONCE SAID IF she were "taking up Christianity seriously" she'd "have to look into Catholicism." Helen McGraw, assistant manager Savoy-Plaza Hotel then and now manager of Town House, New York, heard her say she'd like to talk over things with Bishop Sheen, arranged introduction.

Introduction followed. Conditionally baptized by Bishop Sheen at Church of Christ the King, Yonkers, May 31, 1952. Received First Holy Communion following day; Feast of the Holy Ghost, 1952.

Presently studying "Tosca" and "Carmen" looking to operatic debut Mexico or Italy next year.

Unmarried; lives with parents while in Hollywood where she attends Church of the Blessed Sacrament.
