### Hardships Of India Life Told By SVD Missionary

"There are never two days alike in India," the Rev. Gerard Hofstee of the Society of the Divine Word, a missionary of more than 15 years in that country, told the Fathers, Brothers and Seminarians at St. Michael's Mission House, Conesus, on a visit last week.

To confirm his story, the missionary showed films on the life and habits of the people of India to the assembled community.

"One never knows what will happen as the day progresses," Father Hofstee said. "For the people life is simply a hand-to-mouth affair."

The standard of living is down to rock bottom. Any crop failure in a certain district brings terrible hardships. Corn is the staple food. There are only two meals. For the morning meal, at about ten o'clock, corn is prepared in the form of a mush, cooked in the form of a jumbo pancake. With some vegetables and tea the meal is complete.

THE ORDINARY hut of his people has no windows and the people sleep in it with goats, cattle, chickens. During the cold season there is an open fire, and the door is kept closed to boot.

Fear of robbers and thieves seems to be the reason for this custom. Cow dung is always used for plaster. In fact, preparing cow manure for plaster and fuel is one of India's greatest industries.

### Servicemen's Kin Invited To CWV Tea

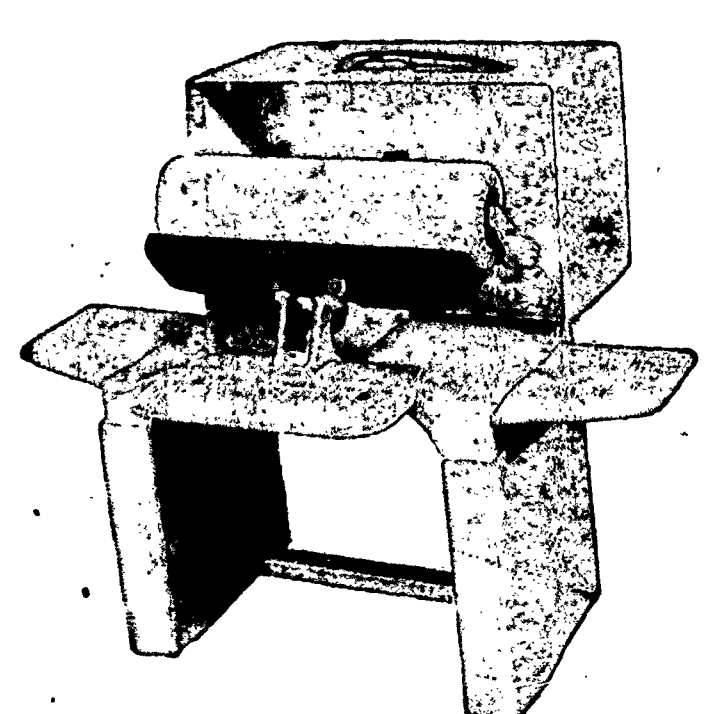
