Before what is expected to be a capacity crowd, Aquinas Institute football team will meet North Catholic High of Pittsburgh in Aquinas Memorial Stadium on Thanksgiving Day with game starting at 11 a.m.

Interest is at fever height at the Dewey Ave. School as Aquinas prepares for its final game. A victory will mean a very successful season but a defeat would turn the season into a mediocre one, the team directors said.

Aquinas had quite a show will be put on at half time. North Catholic High's Record is four wins and three losses.

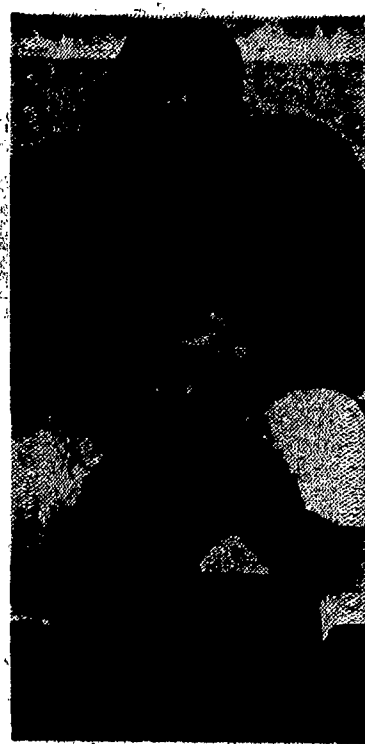

Navajo Indian Asks Schools For His People

Though Chee Dodge in picture here from Ben Wittick Collection of the Library of Anthropology in Santa Fe, looks like Buffalo Bill than an Indian, he was the most distinguished chief in Navajo history. His life story reads like an Horatio Alger tale.



CHIEF CHEE DODGE

Born of a Navajo mother and a white father, both of whom were killed while fleeing from Kit Carson, the famous Indian scout, and the United States Army, he was reared at Fort Defiance on the Navajo Reservation.

YOUNG CHEE learned some English and something of the white man's economy but his sympathies were all Indian. He became a leader of his people and in 1923 at their first Tribal Council meeting was elected their first chairman or chief.

Four times he journeyed to Washington to plead for his people. "The Navajos say schools taste good — they want more," he told the Great White Father. He was responsible for the establishment of the first school house on the reservation — a three-room shack, with a roof only over two rooms.

When the Franciscan Fathers arrived in 1898, Chee was there to act as interpreter and to do whatever he could to foster the mission school they set up.

Bodnar Hits 593 In Auburn Loop
