Divine Word Fathers Cite China Losses

Yonkers, N. Y. — (NC) — Of 335 missionaries of the Society of the Divine Word working in China as of mid-1947, the Chinese Communists have expelled 317.

A report on Communist activities against the society's missionaries shows that one 87-year-old Bishop, 33 priests and two lay brothers remain in the country. However, the Bishop and ten priests are in prison.

The main hope of the Divine Word missions, the report says, rests with 21 native Chinese priests and 20 lay brothers relatively free to carry on their work.

Divine Word missionaries began work in China, the society's first mission field, in 1878. Numerous schools, churches and hospitals built by them with donations from Catholics in every sector of the world have been seized by the Communists.

4,000 Volunteers To Make Muscular Dystrophy Plea

Sheriff Albert W. Skinner, chairman of the Rochester and Seneca County Muscular Dystrophy Appeal, today announced that some 4,000 volunteers will start out at 7 p.m. Monday evening, Nov. 23, to better their mark of \$40,000 raised in the one-night campaign of last year.

This year the ward and town committees of both the Democratic and the Republican parties will work with Sheriff Skinner. In the towns and villages the volunteers' five companies will again canvass on behalf of MDA.

This year J. Malloy, Local County Commander of the Veterans of Foreign Wars, is adding the men and women power of county VFW posts and auxiliary units to the Muscular Dystrophy Campaign led by Sheriff Skinner.

Chinese Reds 'Excommunicated' Italian Missioner

Hong Kong — (NC) — An Italian priest, "excommunicated" by members of the communist-controlled Independent Church, was one of five Italian missionaries who arrived here from communist China.

"You are no longer a priest," they told him. The priest is Father Dionigi Busnelli who arrived here from Kaileng with Brother Victor Polo. The others included Father Enrico Vigo, 76, 40 years a missioner in China, and two who had been working in Chengchow Honan.

According to Father Busnelli, the "trial" at which he was "excommunicated" came after his refusal to sign a paper that said the Pope approves of the Independent Church. Witnesses at his "trial," reports the priest, included "a deaf mute who would shake her head as they directed." Three Italian and eight Chinese priests are still free in the Kaileng area. Two other priests are in prison and one is under house arrest.

Australia To Hear Bishop Sheen Talks

Sydney, Australia — (NC) — Bishop Fulton Sheen's "Life Is Worth Living" program is to be featured by the Catholic radio station 2SM here, it was announced by the station director.

Father T. Muldoon, managing director of the station, said they would broadcast the program through the courtesy of Du Mont network.

In the United States, 260 television stations carry the program to a coast to coast audience of 20,000,000 people a week. Bishop Sheen is Auxiliary of New York and national director of the Society for the Propagation of the Faith in the U.S.

Poverty Of Clergy In Hungary Cited

Budapest — (NC) — A request for money to help retired priests buy fuel for the winter underlying the poverty which many of the clergy in this country are undergoing.

Bishop Andras Hamvas of Csanad recently called on every church in his diocese to send 10 forints (approximately 38 cents) for each 1,000 parishioners to the chancery office to meet this need.

6 Classes To Start In RBI Winter Term

St. Joseph Nun Authors New Work On Constitution

A Sister of Saint Joseph is the author of what has been called "the most thorough, accurate and profound work in existence on our Constitution," according to a pre-publication announcement received at Nazareth College, here, this week.

Sister M. Barbara McCarthy, head of the political science department of Nazareth College, Nazareth, Mich., devoted more than four decades to careful research for the study which is to be published in five volumes as "The Constitution of the United States: A Historical and Textual Commentary."

COVERING THE period from 1787 to 1953, the work includes biographical notes on every Supreme Court Justice, treats 2,000 cases decided by the court, and includes an index-digest of 260 constant and accumulative topics on the Constitution. The latter feature, prepared for the lawyer's ready reference and law student's use as a handbook in legal research, is, according to the publishers, "the most uniquely valuable aid in modern legal scholarship."

Written primarily for judges, lawyers and social scientists, the purpose of the study is to introduce the Constitution as it has been interpreted by the highest courts, and to explain the historical, political, economic and social settings in which the courts' decisions were made.
