# Ohio Court Rules Against Bingo Games

Columbus, Ohio — (RNS) — The Ohio Supreme Court has dealt a death blow to bingo — charity or otherwise — in Columbus.

The high court, reversing the Second District Court of Appeals, restored a Columbus Municipal Court judgment convicting Mrs. Clarissa Barr of operating a keno game.

In doing so, it ruled that the Columbus ordinance banning bingo and similar games was valid and not in conflict with state law.

Mrs. Barr was convicted May 15, 1952, and fined \$100 and costs. She contended that since the city law banned possession of any ticket to be used in a lottery, it conflicted with state law which penalizes such activities only if they are for the operator's "own profit."

Her attorney argued that the keno game she operated was for the benefit of the Trudeau Guild of Benjamin Franklin (Tuberculosis) Hospital.

The appellate court upheld her position and threw out the conviction. The city then appealed.

The high court held that the city had the right to legislate on lotteries "in the exercise of its police power." Such legislation must not conflict with state law, the opinion said, but added: "In prescribing a specific penalty for the operation of gambling transactions for one's own profit, (the state) did not by indirect means legalize the same transaction if carried on not for profit."

"There is no conflict between the ordinance and the statute here."

Bishop Cuthbert O'Gara, C.P., told the Catholic pressmen that secular newspapers have not given similar coverage to the same happenings.

"The Catholic press is to be congratulated because it is the only source of anything like authentic information about events behind the Iron Curtain and the Bamboo Curtain," the Passionist Bishop of Hunan said.

"The secular press seems to ignore to a large extent, and certainly never grows indignant about, events transpiring behind the Bamboo Curtain," he said.

"You will then have a real reason to rejoice in a holy commemoration of His birthday."

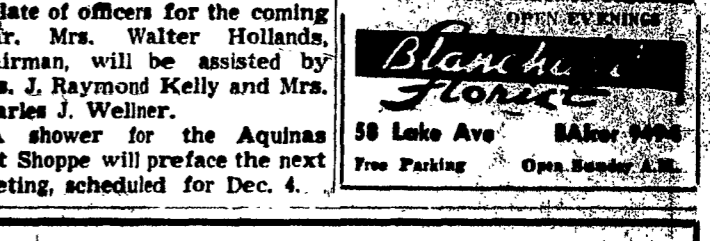
THE LUNCHEON was second in the current series sponsored by Hornell District, Diocesan Council of Catholic Women in honor of Our Lady of Fatima.
