Harry Richard Flaherty, World War I veteran and a member of the firm of Lum & Flaherty, manufacturers' representatives, died suddenly Monday, Nov. 16, 1953 in his home 55 Finch St.

Mr. Flaherty was born in Rochester and attended Holy Rosary School and the old Cathedral High School. He was a sales representative for the Rochester Can Company until he organized his own business in the Powers Building.

In the first World War, he served as a quartermaster in the Aviation Division of the Navy. He was a member of the Holy Name Society and the William W. Douglass Post American Legion. He is survived by his wife, Margaret Townsend Flaherty; three sons, Richard G. Flaherty, C.S.B., a student at the Assumption College, Windsor, Ont., Canada, Harry R. Flaherty Jr. and Norman Townsend; two brothers, Raymond and J. Franklyn Flaherty, both of Rochester.
