

Catholics Stopped Reds In Philippines, Says Gen. Romulo

Cincinnati, O. — (NC) — A Catholic statesman from the Far East asked here for "not tolerance, but friendship, good will and mutual respect" between this country and Asia.

Manila-born General Carlos P. Romulo, hero of the World War II Philippines campaigns and former president of the United Nations General Assembly, called the Philippines "the only Christian nation and the only rampart of democracy in the Far East."

People of the Far East prefer the term "Asian" to the word "Asiatic," Gen. Romulo declared. He explained that in World War II on the Pacific West Coast the word "Asiatic" acquired a "de-regatory connotation."

Masses Mark Thanksgiving In Korea

Seoul, Korea — (NC) — Thanksgiving prayer as well as Thanksgiving Mass marked the first peaceful Thanksgiving Day celebrated by American soldiers, airmen and Marines in Korea since the communist attack in June, 1950.

Catholic chaplains, though considerably below strength numerically, made Mass available wherever possible. Thousands of Catholic servicemen attended the Holy Sacrifice on Thanksgiving Day, all the way from the front line to the port of Pusan.

THE CHAPEL of Eighth Army headquarters in Seoul was crowded for the Mass celebrated by Father (Lieut. Col.) William F. Nern of Milwaukee. Elsewhere in the Seoul area, five Columbian mission priests went to Army and Air Force installations to celebrate Mass on Thanksgiving Day.

Members of some units expressed thanks for their own blessings by helping Korea's needy. For instance, enlisted men at Taegu gave to children at the orphanage conducted by the Saint Paul of Chartres Sisters dinner and a party paid for entirely by soldiers.

German Bishop Visits Red Zone

Hamburg — (NC) — Thousands of Catholics in Mecklenburg, in the northern part of the Soviet Zone, welcomed Auxiliary Bishop Johannes von Rudolf of Osnabrueck during a visitation tour of those areas of his diocese that are behind the Iron Curtain.

Morning and evening Masses were crowded in such cities as Rostock, Wismar and Schwerin. The Bishop dedicated a new church in the town of Schwarz. So far as it is known, the Bishop experienced no difficulties by the communist authorities.

Indian Priests Go To Korea As Chaplains

Bombay — (NC) — Four priests from the Bombay archdiocese are preparing to leave for Korea where they will serve as chaplains to Catholics among the anti-communist war prisoners now under the jurisdiction of the Indian custodial forces.

They are Msgr. A. Lobo, editor of The Examiner, Catholic newspaper, and formerly vicar of St. Stephen's Church here; Father Frederick Britto, S.J., principal of the primary teachers college at Basselin; Father Frank Lobo, former secretary to His Eminence Valerian Cardinal Gracias, Archbishop of Bombay, and now principal of Baptista High School, Basselin, and Father Aloysius L. Perera, S.J., of St. Stanislaus High School in Bombay.

THE FOUR priests, none of whom speak Korean or Chinese, are taking up their new posts as the result of a decision of the Neutral Nations Repatriation Commission, which after much delay has decided to provide the war prisoners with chaplains. Korean and Chinese-speaking priests are available for such duty in Korea, but the majority of the commission opposed using them. The opposition cited the text of the armistice agreement which says that "operating personnel shall be provided exclusively by India."

Florida Diocese Plans 8 Parishes

St. Augustine, Fla. — Ten steps in keeping pace with the growth of the Church in Florida were taken in the Diocese of St. Augustine when Archbishop Joseph P. Hurley, Bishop of St. Augustine, announced the formation of eight new parishes and officiated at the dedication of two new schools.

300,000 Poles Held By Reds In Slave Labor Camps

New York — (NC) — Poland's primate, Stefan Cardinal Wyszynski, is not alone in suffering Red arrest. About 300,000 Polish people are enslaved "openly and officially" in forced labor camps on dumped up charges, a former Polish diplomat said here.

Dr. Marek Korowicz who escaped from a Red United Nations group two months ago, said 40 major slave labor centers and 37 smaller ones are maintained by the communist regime in Poland, every night for a week, and the Polish communists' embassy in Washington has been informed of it.

Father Paul M. Lackner, director of the Pittsburgh Diocesan Union Holy Name Society, in a letter of protest against the Cardinal's arrest, told the Polish embassy that for a whole week, the rosary broadcast audience was told of the outer of the prelate, and that "we are begging them to pray for the return of the Chief Shepherd of the Polish Catholic nation."

Father Lackner said further that the 80,000 Holy Name Society members in 325 parishes and mission churches in the See "are profoundly shocked at this serious crime against a leader of the Catholic Church and outstanding European Churchman."

Dr. Korowicz said the victims are "labeled by special commissions" as "class enemies and capitalists."

He called on the United Nations to take action to abolish the camps, but added that the only way to do so is to "get rid of that appalling government."

Schools Affiliated Washington — (NC) — Sixteen schools in nine states have met the requirements for affiliation with Catholic University of America. Dr. Roy J. Deferrari, chairman of the affiliation committee, announced.
