GOD Love You has been used at the end of broadcasts and telecasts.

God Love You has been used as the title of this column. God Love You has been used as our personal greeting, and God Love You has been used to thank those who have helped the Holy Father's Missions.

Now we want God Love You to become a blessing and a prayer. One day it struck us that there were ten letters in God Love You. In other words, it was a decade on which you could say your prayers. Out of that idea came the God Love You Medal. On one side of the medal is the cross impressed upon the whole earth—the seal of the Holy Father's Society for the Propagation of the Faith. On the other side, as pictured here, is the Blessed Mother. The ten letters in the words "God Love You" are raised and frame the entire medal and thus form a decade on which prayers may be said.



This medal has three purposes: 1) To openly proclaim your love and affection for Our Blessed Mother and to invite her special protection on all who wear it.

2) To enable you to count your Hall Mary's when you do not have time to say a Rosary. For example: when waiting for a bus when darning at bridge when waiting for the elevator when waiting in line for confession when the telephone line is busy when the dentist is boring.

Whenever you have time on your hands take your medal in your hand. As you say a Hail Mary, so you will ever know you are saying a decade of prayers except those who are as good as yourself, and are wearing a God Love You medal.

Researchers Baffled On How Nuns Run Inter-Racial Hospital

Kansas City, Mo. — (NC) — "Those women could make anything work."

That was the answer a group of researchers got when they decided to probe the secret of Kansas City's non-segregated hospital operated by the Sisters of Charity.

St. Vincent's hospital at the request of Bishop Edwin V. O'Hara at Kansas City, has been accepting both white and Negro patients, employees and doctors since December, 1951—and it has worked successfully. A research staff of the Human Relations Department of the University of Kansas decided to move in and find out why.

UNDER HILDON Gibson, Ph.D., the researchers moved freely through the hospital for some months, questioned privately every employee from janitor to administrator, attended staff meetings. In a report, quoted in Hospital Progress, official journal of the Catholic Hospital Association, the research staff expressed "great and genuine admiration."

When it came to outlining why non-segregation worked so well at St. Vincent's, the researchers could only say: "St. Vincent's is in so many ways a peculiar institution."

Peculiar in what way? "We were unable to obtain from Negro employees any evidence of overt manifestations of prejudice or unkind conduct... In fact, most of them when queried about the existence of racial relations responded with a startled 'Here?' Several made it clear that even to ask the question was a little bit absurd."

Then, the researchers found no white personnel dissatisfied with the Negroes, no separations from employment because of the non-segregation policy, no serious problem of supervision or administration. "Had there been such episodes a residue of feeling would have been left which could have been detected by us," said the researchers.

HOW DID St. Vincent's accomplish this? The researchers reported in amazement that "no techniques" were used:

"Beyond talking briefly with the supervisory staff about the 'great opportunity that we have here' the administrator apparently did very little—practically for the very excellent reason that she had no time... Sister

Top British Post

London — (NC) — Sir Ivone Kirkpatrick, the advisor Anthony Eden, British Foreign Secretary, has taken over as permanent Civil Service head of the Foreign Office.

Sir Ivone, career diplomat, is only the second Catholic ever to hold this rank, the other being Lord Tyrrell in 1925 to 1928. Aged 56, married and with two children he is of Irish descent.

Reds Created Marxist School, Says Dr. Dodd

Washington — (NC) — A Red plan to open U. S. schools for the teaching of Marxism led to the establishment of a school that has refused a Justice Department order to register as a communist front, Dr. Bella V. Dodd testified here.

The former communist national committee women told the Subversive Activities Control Board that the Jefferson School for Social Science in Newark came directly out of an idea by Red leaders during World War II to provide schools that would teach Leninism and Marxism to large masses of Americans.

At the same time a group of 134 people, including 10 Protestant ministers and 20 college and university teachers, signed a statement saying that "any attempt to suppress the teaching of Marxism in such an institution as the Jefferson School of Social Science represents a serious threat to all free enquiry."

The Jefferson School is the first of a group of twelve organizations aimed by the Justice Department as "dominated and controlled" by the Communist Party.

Chaplain Awarded Bronze Star Medal

Washington — (NC) — Father (Lt. Comdr.) Leo F. Rice, C. S. S. R., has been awarded the Bronze Star Medal for "exceptional ability, initiative and professional skill" as a chaplain with the 1st Marine Division in Korea during 1953.

Vatican Envoy Rank Again British Issue

London — (NC) — The nomination of a new Apostolic Delegate to London to succeed Archbishop William Godfrey — now appointed to the see of Liverpool — will raise again the old question of diplomatic relations between Britain and the Holy See, Catholic sources here predict.

This, in turn, will probably rouse the venom of Protestant extremists, who have so much sway in British church affairs, at a time when for obscure motives of envy in a moral crisis the moderate, sensible Protestant spokesmen are on less friendly terms than usual of recent years.

ARCHBISHOP GODFREY'S appointment roused a minority storm 15 years ago when he came here as the first Papal representative to this country since the Reformation. Questions were asked in the House of Commons. And whenever any suggestion of a move toward diplomatic recognition has been made others have followed—even in the war years when Archbishop Godfrey and the Holy See did so much as non-belligerent intermediaries in non-political matters, such as contacting prisoners of war.

The position as regards Archbishop Godfrey was eased somewhat after the collapse in Europe because although officially as far as Britain was concerned he had no diplomatic status, he was nominated charge d'Affaires for the Holy See to the Polish Government in exile—the only Papal envoy to hold one post with diplomatic status and another without that status.
