Eight stores in the neighborhood of Holy Rosary Church visited by a committee of the Holy Rosary Holy Name Society were found cooperating in the campaign against indecent reading, it was reported today by President Charles Northcutt.

All stores in the neighborhood excepting one, as this issue went to press, are now eliminating the objectionable reading matter. The proprietors have taken out the material that shouldn't be there and are trying to cooperate with the National Organization of Decent Literature.

SIGNS WHICH announce that the store is cooperating have not yet been distributed but will be by the end of the week. Persons in the neighborhood and particularly parents are asked to look for the signs.

The campaign in Holy Rosary parish is progressing most successfully, the Rev. James Marvin, spiritual director of the Holy Name Society said. He asks that continued effort be made to see that the children are not endangered in the future.

Funeral Rites Conducted For 2 Cathedral Graduates

Funeral services for F. Leo Hogan were conducted at the Joseph A. Murphy Funeral Home, 363 Chili Ave. and at St. Monica's Church on Friday morning, Nov. 27.

They followed by two days, funeral services for his friend and classmate, Raymond L. Guppy, whose funeral took place at the N. J. Miller's Funeral Home, 706 South Ave. on Wednesday, Nov. 25 and at St. Boniface Church.

Mr. Guppy, life insurance agent and widely known athlete died on Nov. 21, 1933 in Highland Hospital. Mr. Hogan died Nov. 23, 1933 before he reached Genesee hospital in an ambulance.

Requiem Mass for Mr. Hogan was offered in St. Monica's Church by the Rev. Michael P. O'Brien and the Very Rev. Msgr. Gerald C. Lambert was in the sanctuary.

Bearers were Joseph P. Flynn, Walter T. Branigan, Neil P. Collins and Thomas H. O'Connor, all fellow-Tenites of Mr. Hogan. Raymond Hogan and Edward Sweegney.

He was also a member of Rochester Council and Fourth Degree Assembly, Knights of Columbus, Muss Caravan, Order of the Alhambra, and Holy Name Society of St. Monica.

He was a veteran church choir singer.

He is survived by his wife, Edna McAlester Hogan, two nieces and one nephew.

Mr. Guppy was a special agent here for 35 years with the New York Life Insurance Company.

He was known for his ability as a pocket billiards champion in the Knights of Columbus and as a semi-professional baseball player. He earned the Notre Dame University monogram playing on the team there.

He and Mr. Hogan were graduates of old Cathedral grammar and high schools. He was a member of St. Boniface Church and the Notre Dame Alumni Club.

Mr. Guppy is survived by his wife, Evelyn; one daughter, Kathleen and one sister, Mrs. Melva Boland.
