The Catholic Theater Guild will present a play entitled "Journey of the Three Kings."

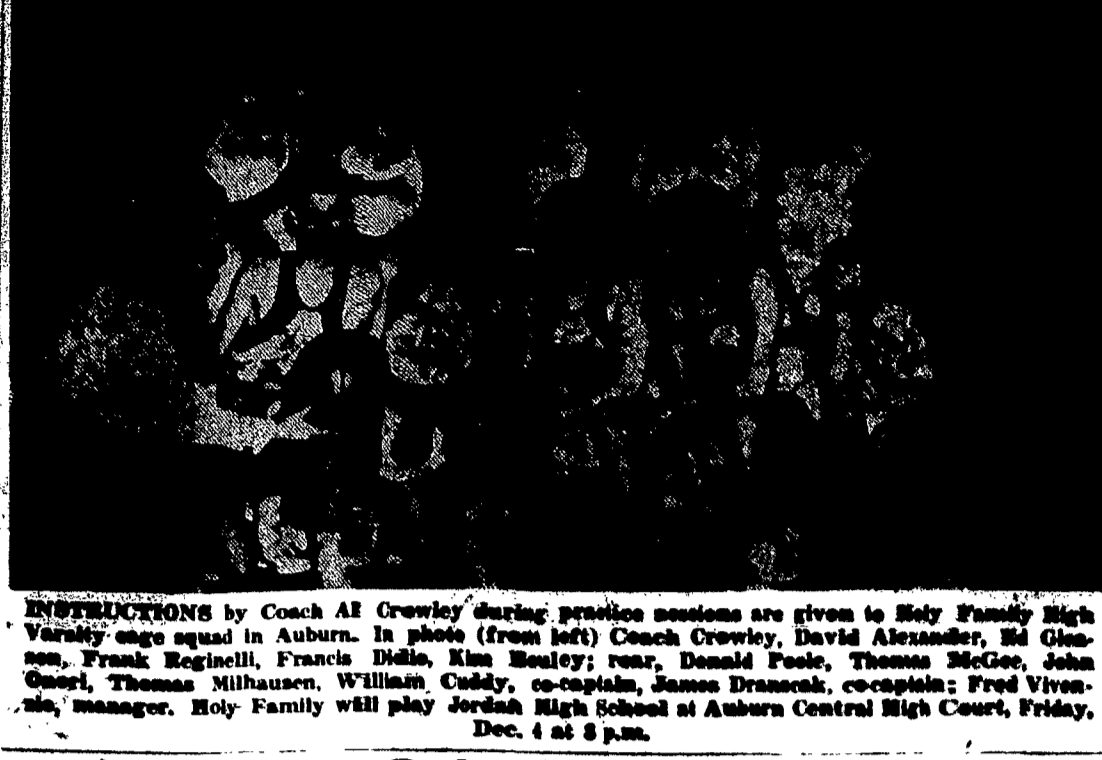
