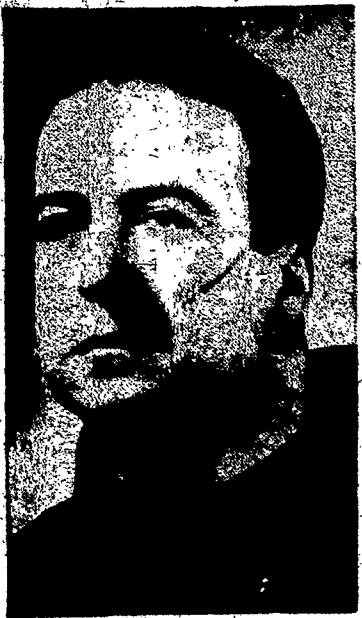


St. Bonaventure University Dean Dies At Age 42

St. Bonaventure, N.Y. — A Solemn Requiem Mass was celebrated Tuesday, Dec. 1, in St. Bonaventure Church, Allegany, for the repose of the soul of Rev. Vincent E. Devine, O.F.M., 42, Dean of St. Bonaventure University, who died in St. Clare's Hospital, New York City, Nov. 28, 1953. Father Vincent died while undergoing surgery for the second time since he entered the hospital about 10 days previously.

Father Vincent had been dean of St. Bonaventure since 1946. It was during his tenure of office that St. Bonaventure became a university in 1950. Last Spring, he completed a reorganization of the university's pre-engineering students at St. Bonaventure are able to transfer without loss of credit to the College of Engineering of the University of Detroit.

On campus, he was moderator of the recently established John Duns Scotus Honor Society.

VINCENT was born in Cambridge, Mass., on May 30, 1911. He entered St. Joseph's Preparatory Seminary in Callicoon, N.Y., at the age of 14. He was admitted to the priesthood in 1936 and entered the Franciscan Order.

He received his philosophy training in Cambridge, N.Y., and later, N.Y. Franciscan house. He received his theology training at St. Bonaventure College in Salamanca, D.C., and was assigned to the priesthood in Washington on June 15, 1937.

After ordination, his first assignment was at St. John College in Washington, D.C. He was named dean of St. John in 1939. He left St. John in 1942 to enter St. Bonaventure University for advanced studies. He received his master's degree from Columbia in 1944 and, in 1946, received the doctor of philosophy degree from St. Bonaventure.

He was dean of St. Bonaventure from 1946 to 1953.

Nurses Hear Call To Enter Religious Life

Providence, R. I. — (NC) — The need for more hospitals, more nursing nuns and a Mary-like attitude among nurses, was stressed by prelates here.

"You cannot be a good nurse unless you are a good Mary," Bishop Russell J. McViney of Providence told 800 delegates to a New England regional conference of diocesan councils of Catholic nurses.

her profession," the Bishop said. "She would not have dedicated herself to the nursing profession if she had not been impelled by a generous self-effacing love for her fellowman."

The scarcity of nursing nuns was decried by Archbishop Richard J. Cushing of Boston, who stated that the nurse finds fulfillment of her vocation as a nursing nun.

The Boston prelate, who is episcopal chairman of the National Council of Catholic Nurses, stated that he could not understand why so few nurses followed up their vocation into the religious life. "There is no better preparation for the religious life," he declared, "than the nurses' daily routine."

As principal speaker of the convention, Bishop McViney called the work of nursing a "most ennobling profession."

He compared the work of the Catholic nurse to "the first nursing mission of the Christian era" when Mary visited her cousin Elizabeth, before the birth of St. John, and to Pietà scenes in which Mary hold the dead Christ in her arms.

"The good nurse who pledges her service to suffering humanity in the sublime obligation of self-holds afflicted humankind in her comforting arms. Necessarily her charities are multiplied beyond her nazareth," Bishop McViney said.
