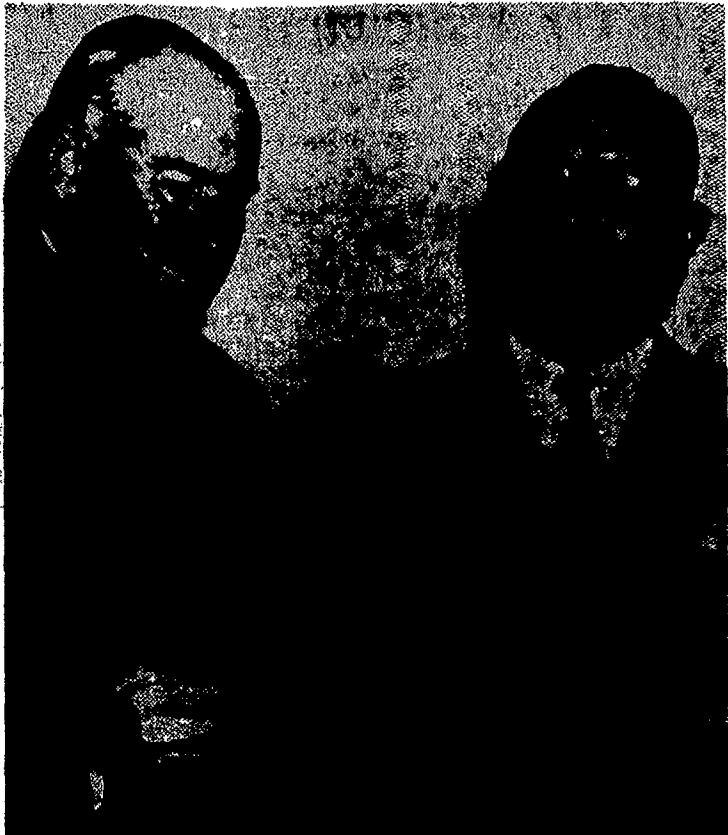

Alaska Would Halt Reds, Says Priest

Alaska would not be an open gate to America, the Rev. Bernard R. Hubbard, S. J. told 700 persons in the Thomas More Lecture Forum in Rochester Chamber of Commerce Tuesday night. He spoke on the possibility of a Russian invasion. (Father Hubbard will be interviewed by the Rev. Richard Torney on the Catholic Hour, WHAM, Sunday, Dec. 13 at 12:15 p.m.) The famed "Glacier Priest" spoke from experience and observation in the Alaska wilds. "Why should we be afraid if the Russians do come over?" the noted Jesuit said. "Let them be afraid of us!" He termed Alaska an impenetrable, clinched fist against any invading army. He said it would be fatal for a Russian army to hop the 2 1/2 mile
