Announcement of the appointment of the 24-year-old Diute, who played basketball with Sam Urzetta, at St. Bonaventure, also of East Rochester and national golfing fame, was made by John Trevisan, director of the CYA. Both Diute and Trevisan are graduates of St. Bonaventure and both are natives of Binghamton.

A Rochester sailor was among a large group of Catholic officers and men of the aircraft carrier U.S.S. Lake Champlain who made a pilgrimage to the Shrine of Our Lady of Fatima in Portugal on returning from extended duty off Korea.

The men including Sam W. Dauria AK2 of 9 Costar St., a graduate of Jefferson High School and a member of St. Anthony of Padua Parish, made a public act of thanksgiving at the shrine for their safe and successful cruise.

The Lake Champlain left the United States last Spring and every evening after supper the men gathered together to recite the Rosary in honor of Our Lady of Fatima.

SPECIAL NOVENA devotions in Her honor were held once a week. Recently when the ship visited Lisbon, Portugal on its return home, the men formed the largest pilgrimage of Navy personnel ever to visit the world famous shrine where Mary appeared to three children in 1917. Enroute to Fatima over the hundred miles of winding and rising roads the men in the long procession of buses recited the fifteen decades of the Rosary. Navy Chaplain, Joseph A. Kelly of the Archdiocese of Chicago celebrated Mass in the magnificent Basilica at which the men received Holy Communion.

During the visit three men were baptized by Father Kelly and received their First Holy Communion. Luncheon was served the large group by the Dominican Sisters who operate a large guest house near the Shrine.
