Keating Heard At Notre Dame U.
Among five speakers scheduled during a symposium sponsored by the University of Notre Dame College of Law on Dec. 9 on the problem of protecting witnesses in legislative investigations was Representative Kenneth E. Keating of New York.

Papers were presented by the five speakers on various aspects of the problem which Dean Joseph O'Meara, Jr. said "constitutes a challenge as insistent as any that has faced the legal profession in its long history."

Representative Keating whose home is in Rochester is serving his fourth term in Congress where he is a member of the Committee on the Judiciary and chairman of the Subcommittee to Investigate the Department of Justice. He studied at the University of Rochester, received his law degree from Harvard in 1923 and has practiced law in Rochester since that time. Keating served as a colonel during World War II principally in the China-Burma-India Theater of operations.

Other speakers according to the University of Notre Dame press release were William T. Gossett, vice president and general counsel of Ford Motor Co. who served as moderator; Brigadier-General Telford Taylor, New York attorney and former chief prosecutor of the Nuremberg War Crimes Trials; George Morris Fay, Washington, D. C. attorney and lecturer on criminal law at the Catholic University of America; Abe Fortas, Washington, D. C. attorney and former Undersecretary of the Interior; and Marshall Smelser, associate professor of history at Notre Dame.
