

The Irish nation is in "grave danger of vanishing." Communists particularly to get according to a new book, "The Vanishing Irish," published rica of the popular shrine of Our here by the McGraw Hill Company.

This conclusion is reached by the book's editor, Father John A. O'Brien of the University of Notre Dame, and a group of Irish writers, playwrights, novelists and acholars who contributed to the volume. Among the contributors are Maura Laverty who contributed "Woman-shy Irishnen"; Sean O"Faolain, "Love Among the Irish": Kathleen Norris, "Muled Wedding Bells," and Margaret Culkin Banning, "There is 8till Hope."

The book which has been chosen as the book of the month by the Irish Book Club of America, states that 61 per cent of the people in Eire are unmarried. In America, the situation of those who migrated here from Ireland, is not quite so bad, the author says. But even here, too many of the Irish carry over their idea of not marrying at all or of marrying only at a late date. As a result, "there are more old bachelors and spinsters, among the Irish in. America than among any other national group "the editor states.

Ireland has been steadily declining in population for more than a century, Father O'Brien says. "If this ominous trend continues, in another century the Irish gate will have vanished." continues Father O'Brien.

From a total population in 1841 of 8,177,845, Ireland has dwindled 'to a nation of but 4,330,172 in 1951. Northern Ireland has decreased during this period by a total of 278,366. The population of the 26" counties now constituting the Republic of Ireland has suffered a loss of 3.568.407.

Many reasons are offered by the contributors to the book for this decrease and for the very few number of people who marry in Ireland: engagements lasting from five to fifteen years, the idea; of Irish mothers who feel that their sons should stay at home until they are 40, "the cagey attitude of the Irish bachelor who would rather sit at the local pub than court a pretty girl."

Even with all the dire statistics given, John D. Sheridan in his contribution, "We're Not Dead Yet," sees hope, for, as he says, "I will have no hand in sending out the invitations to the funeral. God is good and we aren't dead yel!"

# Czech Reds Jail Bishop For Urging Marian Year Rites

Vienna - (NC) - Reports reaching here from Czecho-Slovakia state that Bishop Karel Skoupy of Brno has been arrested by the regime for his efforts to organize Marian Year devotions in that Communāst dominated country.

The Bishop reportedly defied a Red warning given Church authorities last month that they should ignore the Marian Year; proclaimed by His Holiness Pope Paus XII on September 8.

BISHOP SKOUPY is said to have expressed his determination to go ahead with plans for strengthening devotion to the Blessed Mother during the Marian Year and to have readied a pastoral for this purpose.

NO VATICAN action or comment has yet been involved in the matter of the "Weeping Madonna." No report of any kind has appeared in Osservatore Romano, but it is not considered unlikely that the Vatican newspaper soon will have something to say about the event.

Competent authorities here have pointed out that in cases of this kind, it is the duty and responsibility of the Bishop of the place involved to decide in the first instance about the character of such manifestations. It was reported at the time the miraculous event had first occurred that Archbishop Ettore Baranzini of Syracuse had immediately investigated, ordering a chemical analysis of the tears and instituting a diocesan investigation.



## **Hungarian Reds Reported** Worried Lest Marian Year Will Kill 'Cult Of Marx'

Dublin-(NC)-Hungary's chief Communist theorist, it is reported here, has warned that the Marian Year must be suppressed in that country otherwise "the cult of Mary would in the end prevail over the cult of Marx and Lenin."

A dispatch in the Standard, Catholic weekly here, quoted from a speech it says Joseph Revai, head of the propagands section of the Hungarian Communist central committee, gave in Budapest at a meeting of cultural workers,
