

On that day America's 30 mil-

lion Catholics are being asked to flock to their churches for special services. They are asked to plead with God for strength for their suffering brethren and for light and repentance for the

> persecutors. In a letter to pastors of the diocese, Bishop Kearney directs that public Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament be conducted in all churches on Dec. 27 from the last Mass until evening de-

votions. "Urge your people to come and pray for our co-religionists whose ribs have been demolished and loced," the Bishop advises.
