Marian Slogan 'Family That Prays Is Family That Lives'

Vatican City — (NC) — Members of a Rome parish were given a Marian Year slogan by His Holiness Pope Pius XII which was similar to one made famous by Father Patrick Peyton, C.S.C., America's world-renowned family prayer crusader.

The Pope's slogan was: "The Family that prays is a family that lives." It was reminiscent of Father Peyton's rallying cry: "The Family that prays together stays together."

THE HOLY FATHER used the phrase in a talk to the Rome parishioners, each of whom had begun the Marian Year by pledging to recite the Rosary with their families every day.

He said that the Rosary is one of the simplest and most complete of all prayers. Pope Pius said it was also "one of the most beautiful ways of putting oneself in communication with Heaven."

Geneva — If some child or adult in Korea has a warm coat to keep out the cold, it may be because of the clothing supplied by St. Francis de Sales and St. Stephen's parishes.

Eight tons of clothing were collected in the Thanksgiving Week clothing drive in the two parishes. Sixteen thousand pounds of clothing were sorted and packed. Approximately five and a half tons were collected in St. Francis de Sales and two-and-a-half tons in St. Stephen's parish.

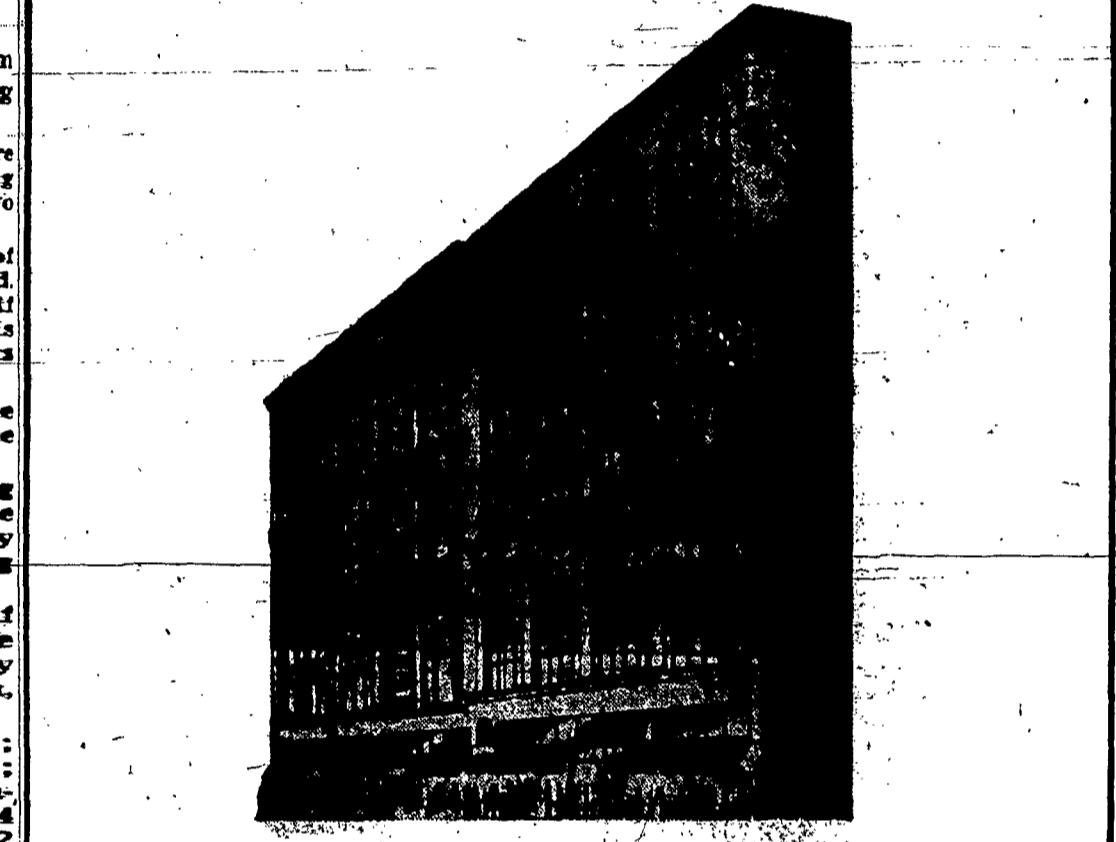
