Polio Sufferer Fashions Crib, Paints Figurines

Handicapped by the results of an attack of poliomyelitis he suffered when five years of age, Bernard A. Hoepfel, of 133 Sunset St., used his skill and talents over the past year to fashion a Nativity scene on the family front lawn which has attracted wide attention.
Employed by the city as a sign painter, the young man, now 24, made and painted all the images used in the scene himself. He sawed the figurines from plywood and hand painted them, all with his left hand.
TO MAKE THE Crib more effective he spotlights it at night and Christmas music is heard from a recorder.
He also assisted in the erection of Holy Apostles Church Crib, painting the "Gloria In Excelsis Deo" with striking effect.
Treasurer of the Holy Apostles Holy Name Society, he is also a member of the Nocturnal Adoration Society.
He is deeply interested in the success of the 1954 March of Dimes campaign underway and knows that it will result in needed assistance to others stricken by polio.

Japanese Violinist Leads Entire Family To Church

Philadelphia — (NC) — A Japanese violinist, whose concert successes have extended through Japan, Mexico and the United States to New York's Carnegie Hall, has led his entire family to the Catholic Faith.
Toshiya Eto, 24-year-old violinist, attended a Tokyo school staffed by the Silesian Fathers because his father wanted him to study languages under Western teachers. Given full religious liberty by his father, he studied the Catechism and, after two years, was baptized a Catholic with the name, Joseph.
His example drew his sisters, then his parents into the Faith. During the war, the entire Eto family defied, at the risk of death, an order to take down every sign of religion in the household, remaining staunch Catholics.
Mr. Eto is presently teaching violin at the Curtis Institute of Music in Philadelphia.
