

Montreal Cardinal Gives Funds For Blind School

Montreal — (NC) — The Institut Louis Braille, school for blind youth over 12, has a new permanent home as a result of efforts of His Eminence Paul Emile Cardinal Leger, Archbishop of Montreal.

The story of financing the project was disclosed at the blessing of the new building by the Cardinal.

When His Eminence returned from Rome a year ago after receiving the Red Hat, the clergy and faithful of the Archdiocese of Montreal presented a purse of \$10,000 to him. Cardinal Leger gave the purse towards the purchase of the new home for the Institut. In addition there was a special collection in all the churches of the Archdiocese for aid to the blind. This added another \$35,000.

John Paul Sauve, Quebec Youth and Social Welfare Minister, said that \$75,000 would be included in his department's budget to look after the cost of administration of the school. The government also has assisted in refurbishing the institute and in translating the school text books into Braille.

The Institut is directed by the Victorian Fathers. Father Jean Cypriot, C.S.V., is superior, and Father Roland Campbell, C.S.V., Canada's first blind priest, is the spiritual director.

USO Official Scores Actress's Publicity Exploits

Los Angeles — (NC) — An official of USO Camps Shows here expressed resentment at a Hollywood actress who exploited an entertainment tour in Korea "to make personal publicity for herself," while 42 other people in the show "who are doing a good job receive little or no recognition."

Radio Speakers Named For Program Series

Washington — (NC) — Father Joseph Manton, C.S.S.R., of the Mission church, Boston, Mass., will be the Catholic Hour speaker during January and February. General title of the series is "Bridge to Better Living."

The Christian in Action radio series will feature Father David Coffey of Providence, R. I. He will deliver a special Marian Year series "Jewels in Her Crown."

Father Joseph Moody of Cathedral College in New York will speak in a series entitled "Towers and Walls" in the Faith in Our Time radio program.

All of the programs are sponsored by the National Council of Catholic Men. The Catholic Hour is aired on NBC Sundays from 2-2:30 p.m.; EST. Network ABC carries The Christian in Action series Sundays 11:30 a.m. to 12 noon EST. The Faith in Our Time series is broadcast on MBS on Thursdays from 10:15-10:30 a.m., EST.

MR. MURPHY recalled that the actress before her departure had given definite assurances that she would not use any material that could possibly give offense nor would she use a "questionable costume which I consider in extremely bad taste." The actress herself was quoted as saying she would not do anything "that isn't in good taste."

"I did everything I could to make certain that she did not take the suit with her. She assured me that she did not have it and would not use it," Mr. Murphy said. "I am proud of the record we have made with Camp Shows, and I am determined to fire back."

MR. MURPHY's statement followed conflicting reports that either Army authorities or USO Camp Shows had ordered the actress to return home after she had, contrary to promises before her departure, used the objectionable bathing suit in performances in Korea.

Army spokesmen in Washington declared they had no knowledge of any orders for the actress' return, indicating that bearing definite information, they considered the whole affair another publicity stunt. A similar view had been previously expressed when stories and pictures advertising the actress' forthcoming visit in the Army newspaper "Stars and Stripes" were labeled a "publicity gag perpetrated by a person with a perverted sense of humor."

Mr. Murphy explained that the actress, while going to Korea under USO Camp Show auspices, was under Army regulations of being in her actual stay in Korea. Any action regarding her return would have to be taken by Army officials, he said.

Luther Movie Prompts Pamphlet

Notre Dame, Ind. — (NC) — "Martin Luther: The Priest who Founded Protestantism" is the title of a new pamphlet written by Father John A. O'Brien of Notre Dame and published by the Paulist Press, New York. Father O'Brien said the pamphlet was written in response to the requests of thousands of Catholics who saw the movie, "Martin Luther."

Father O'Brien's pamphlet, which treats the life and work of the Augustinian monk, is written in a calm, friendly and objective manner. On all controversial points it cites chiefly the testimony of eminent Protestant historians to establish the facts.

The study embodies the findings of recent historical and psychiatric research which shows that Luther was afflicted "with a serious scrupulosity—complex complicated with recurrent attacks of melancholia." During these attacks, Father O'Brien writes, Luther suffered excruciating torture and haunted the confessional for as much as six hours at a time.

400,000 Listed At Papal Audiences

Vatican City — (NC) — Almost 400,000 persons have been received in audience by His Holiness Pope Pius XII during the year 1953, according to statistics released here. In receiving these visitors the Holy Father made 84 addresses.

The majority—348,134—were received in general audiences, which are usually held in St. Peter's Basilica, the Hall of Benedictions or at the Papal summer residence in Castelgandolfo. Another 30,832 persons met the Pontiff in special audiences, 2,126 were received in semi-private and 492 in private audiences. The latter category included Bishops, rulers and heads of state and diplomats of foreign countries accredited to the Holy See.

Civic Award Denver — (NC) — Father James Moynihan has won a civic award for youth work in this city scene of a hearing in the recent Congressional investigation into juvenile delinquency.

He has been given the 1953 Denver Juvenile Court Award for Work with Youth.

Family Of Seven Killed In Crash

Chicago — (NC) — Nearly 100 relatives and friends assisted at a Requiem High Mass in St. Teresa's Church here for the Galle family which was wiped out in an auto-train crash. Father Robert E. Faragher, assistant pastor, offered the Mass.

Seven caskets with the bodies of the family were lined up in front of the altar railing. In two gray coffins standing in the middle were the bodies of Fred Galle, Jr., 37, and his wife, Violet, 33. In five white ones on either side were the bodies of their children, Audrey, 12; Evelyn, 10; John, 8; Elaine, 6; and Carol Ann, 1.

Mr. Galle and his family were killed December 20 when their car was demolished by a Soo Line train two miles south of Wheeling, Ill. They were returning from his mother's house with Christmas gifts for their children.

In the role of Our Lady she will be called on to depict the Virgin from the age 16 to 45. Costarred and in the role of St. Joseph will be Sydney Smith. Others in the cast include Abbey Lewis, Brandon Peters and Tom Charlesworth.

The productions will be done in arena style with a minimum of scenery and emphasis on character delineation. The series is bolstered with many splendid examples of music, art and literature that drew their inspiration from the life of Mary.
