**Holy Rosary Series Lists  
27 Topics For Inquirers**

A new Catholic Information Series at Holy Rosary Church hall will begin on Thursday, Jan. 14, at 7:30 p.m. according to the Rt. Rev. Msgr. Charles F. Shay, pastor who reports four inquiry classes successfully completed.

The Rev. James Marvin, Director of the Inquiry Forum said today that of the 53 non-Catholics who have taken instruction in these classes, 31 have been received into the Catholic Church. He said 87 Catholics have attended the classes to date.

A new group of converts will make the Profession of Faith and be baptized on Jan. 9.

While the talks given are for non-Catholics, members of the Catholic church are welcome. A question period follows each talk. The inquirer may address his question publicly to the speaker or privately to one of the priests. Speakers are priests assigned to Holy Rosary Church, Father Marvin and the Rev. Bernard Dolan.

No charge is made for the series and literature to supplement the talk is given free of charge. Reliable baby sitters will

be provided free of charge by contacting one of the priests.

The National Ambulance and Oxygen Service is owned and operated by George S. Heisel, Jr., a member of Our Lady of Lourdes Parish. He is a brother of the Rev. Raymond G. Heisel, assistant pastor of St. Andrew's Church, Rochester.

Starting in business about a year ago, National added two new Cadillac Superior Ambulances to their growing fleet.

BEHINDS BEING equipped with Two-way F.M. Radios, latest oxygen therapy, and first aid equipment, each ambulance has a complete Catholic Sick Call Case for use when the priest administering the last rites of the church is present. National has found that many homes are without proper Extreme Unction facilities and having it at hand has proven to be a convenience to the priest when performing the Sacrament.

National Ambulance offers free service to all convents and seminaries.

Each ambulance is supervised by a male nurse and enough oxygen to transport a patient 24 consecutive hours while oxygen is being administered.

National Ambulance & Oxygen Service is authorized to transfer patients to and from every hospital at a rate within reach of everyone. \$1000 anywhere in Rochester or Brighton Heisel said. Mr. Heisel's wife, the former Rosemary Gagli, is a registered nurse and a graduate of St. Mary's Hospital School of Nursing. Their five children attend Our Lady of Lourdes School.
