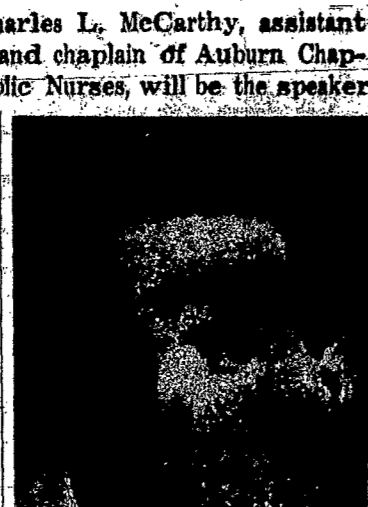

World Wide Observance Set Of Chair Of Unity Octave

Chair of the Unity Octave observances will surpass all past observances according to plans being made throughout the U. S. and reported by NCWC News Service.

Here in the Diocese of Rochester, the observance will be conducted in a solemn manner at St. Patrick's and St. Mary's Churches, Elmira; St. Vincent de Paul's in Corning; St. John's Atoneement Seminary in Montour Falls and St. Mary's of the Lake Church, Watkins Glen. This was announced by the Rev. DeSales Standerwick, S.A., chairman of the local committee at Montour Falls.

THE EIGHT days (January 15 to 23) set aside for prayer that all people may be united in the Catholic Church will be observed with special liturgy and services in more than 20 places including St. Patrick's Cathedral in New York City and the Shrine of the Immaculate Conception in Washington, D. C.

From Unity Octave national headquarters, administered by the Franciscan Friars of the Atoneement, more than 32,000 letters and pamphlets on the octave have been distributed, with additional leaflets sent to 1,500 chaplains in the armed forces.

Friars in the Eternal City reported that Rome's solemn observance of the Unity Octave will be "the best ever held" with eight Cardinals presiding at each day's ceremonies. National colleges in Rome will cooperate in processions, services, and a special Oriental night observance in which 16 different Oriental rites will be represented.

ONE CONTRIBUTION of the North American College in Rome will be a daily magazine presenting the day's intentions, prayers and explanations of the services.

Octave prayers will be recited at morning Mass in the 400 churches of Rome and sermons from the Church of Gae will be transmitted by radio to parish churches of the city each evening.

Center of the solemn observance of the octave in Japan will be St. Joseph's Church in Tsurumi, including the Sacrifice of the Mass in the Russian Rite with Bishop Luke Arai of Yokohama presiding.

In the U. S., for the first time, St. Patrick's Cathedral will be the focal point of the New York observance with eight Bishops presiding.

TO PROMOTE the New York observance posters will be displayed in subway and on automobiles in the city.

At the Catholic University of America in Washington, the crypt of the Shrine of the Immaculate Conception will be the central point of U. S. Unity Octave observances with eight Bishops presiding and officiating at Benediction.

Washington street cars will carry Octave posters. Ten local radio broadcast three local telecasts and one national radio program on the CBS network will record the Washington observances.

Scheduled to preside at the Shrine of the Immaculate Conception are Archbishop Patrick O'Boyle of Washington, Auxiliary Bishop J. Carroll McCormick of Philadelphia, Bishop James A. McIntyre of Paterson, Bishop Elise Kurz, O.F.M., Auxiliary Bishop Joseph P. Hodges of Richmond, Bishop Bryon J. McEnte-

gart, Rector of the Catholic University, and Archbishop Richard J. Cushing.

Speakers will include Father Edmund D. Bernard, Bishop Daniel Ivancho of the Greek Rite Exarchate in Pittsburgh, Father David F. Gannon, S.A., Father Joseph Mantou, C.S.S.R., Father Ignatius Smith, O.P., Father Victor Donovan, C.F.R., and Archbishop Cushing.

Geneva — A creche, hand-carved in Switzerland, in keeping with all of the hand-carved statuary in the church, attracted considerable attention this holiday season in St. Stephen's Church.

Another feature of the holiday setting was an outdoor Nativity scene which was set up between two stately evergreen trees on the church lawn. Trees and creche were illuminated with Christmas lights.

"It was our purpose to bring the real meaning of Christmas to the community. We hope that people will be brought closer to Christ and His Blessed Mother as they gaze upon it," said the pastor, the Rev. Raymond F. Nolan.

FATHER NOLAN also called attention of parishioners to the new set of gold vestments which were worn for the first time at the Midnight Mass. These vestments were imported from Lyons, France. They were purchased in anticipation of the golden jubilee celebration of St. Stephen's parish in 1954, at a date to be decided by His Excellency Bishop Kearney.

Both St. Stephen's and St. Francis de Sales parishes observed the day of prayer for suffering members of the church in Europe and the Orient.

Inmates Express Thanks To 'Father Lane's Gang'

Appreciation of inmates at Elmira Reformatory for Christmas cheer received from "Father Lane's Gang," is expressed in an editorial in the Reformatory publication.

The "Gang" is a group of former inmates named after the Rt. Rev. Msgr. Francis J. Lane, Catholic chaplain at the reformatory.

The editorial says: "The Christmas season is one of the joy, happiness, and holiness throughout the world. Being away from their loved ones and friends, somewhat hampers this spirit of Christmas for the inmates inside of any institutional walls. There are some men among us, who through no fault of their own, have no one outside to convey to them some of the joy of Christmas that most of us know.

"Most of these men carry with them a feeling of hostility and dejection. Seeing other inmates carry to their cells, packages they received from home and watching the men pass their cells with Christmas cards, helps in making these inmates feel the way they do.

"This feeling of hostility and dejection has been somewhat lessened through the generosity of Father Lane and his Gang. The day before Christmas a group of men, singled out by Father Lane, from the men who received nothing from home, were called to his office. Here they received on behalf of Father Lane and his Gang, a package of personal items, consisting of: cigarettes, candy, soap, toothpaste, etc."

"To them who received packages from home every month, this generous act may seem trivial. But to those who receive nothing what so ever, it fills them with a feeling of gratitude and appreciation. This is the main intention of distributing these packages during the Christmas season.

It has been the practice of Father Lane's Gang in the past few years to distribute these packages among the neediest, during the Christmas season. As most of us know, Father Lane's Gang is made up of successful graduates of the Elmira Reformatory.
