Corporal Listed As Dead In Korea

Cpl. Patrick Robert Glennon, who attended St. Augustine's School before enlisting and was reported missing in Korean action since Nov. 1, 1950 was listed by the Defense Department as "presumed dead" on Friday, Jan. 8.



A week before he was reported missing, Glennon's parents heard from him that his unit was under heavy fire, and that he wondered about chances of "getting out."

The young infantryman had planned a career in the Army. He enlisted for three years in November, 1949, served almost six months, then was given an honorable discharge. He re-enlisted for six years. He was 17 when reported missing.

Besides St. Augustine's School, he also attended Paul Revere Trade School, and worked at the Moose Club before enlisting. He was the son of John Glennon, 638 Brown St.
