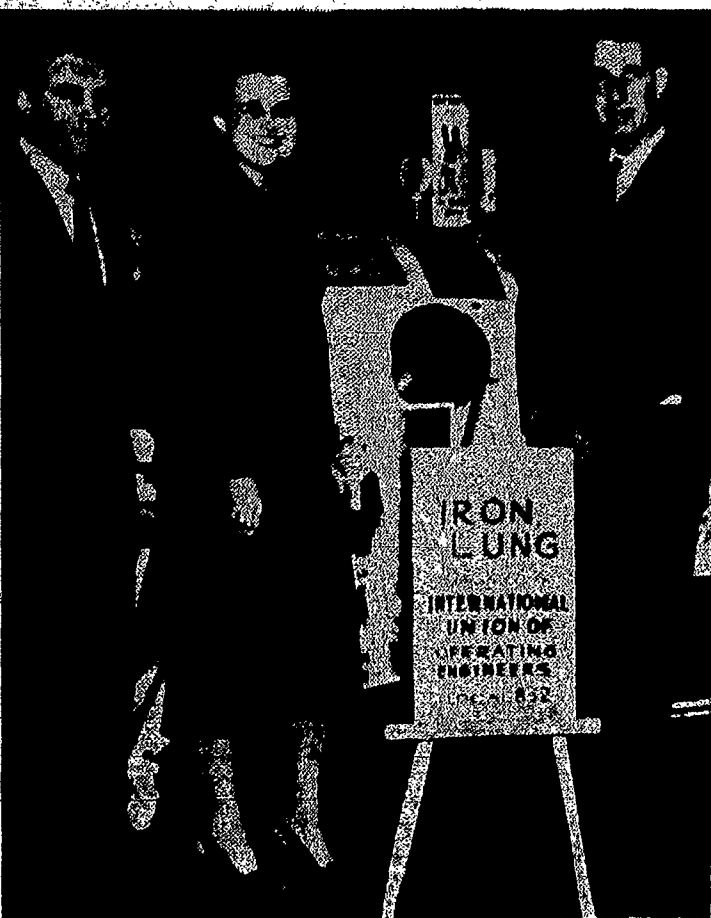


UNION GIVES 'IRON LUNG'

Bishop Casey Cites Value Of Nazareth Cadet Training

His Excellency, Auxiliary Bishop Casey was guest and speaker at the January seventh meeting of the Parents' Club of Nazareth Hall.

Addressing the parents, the Bishop commended both parents and faculty on their enthusiasm and cooperation in furthering the success of the cadet program. "Respect for authority and obedience are natural outcomes of such training," the Bishop stated.

CHARACTER TRAINING was the central theme of the Bishop's talk. The school, the home, the Church and the neighborhood are all agencies in the formation of the child's character. Each agency is dependent on the other. He stressed the point that the example of parents was the most potent factor in the life of their children. The Bishop's final note was a reminder that not only Holy Family Sunday, but every Sunday

should be marked by family Communion. "If you wish peace, serenity and love to be firmly established in your home," Bishop Casey said, "make frequent visits to the altar rail."

Vatican's Holy Land Stand Defended By Msgr. McMahon

A policy of "with malice toward none" is being pursued by the Church in its attitude toward the Holy Land question. Msgr. Thomas J. McMahon, president of the Pontifical Mission for Palestine, emphasized in his address at the Chamber of Commerce. "The Catholic Church pursues its most justifiable crusade for the integrity of the Holy Places in Palestine," the Monsignor said. "for the internationalization of the entire zone of Jerusalem and for justice to 800,000 homeless Arab refugees as well as for full liberty to Arab and Jewish minorities in the State of Israel." Monsignor McMahon, who also is national secretary of the Catholic Near East Welfare Association, lectured on "Whence and Whither Palestine?" before the St. Thomas More Forum, sponsored by the Courier Journal. "It has been interesting to watch the trends of propaganda, not seldom accompanied by a smear campaign, since the awful events of April and May, 1948, when the Holy Land became a scene of intestine strife between Jew and Arab," Monsignor McMahon said. "HE RECALLED that at first there was the cry that not a single Christian voice was raised in protest" and there was the attempt to make the world "forget that Pope Pius XII had written his first Encyclical on Jerusalem and the Holy Places" on May 1, 1949. He said there also was an follow-up by the Catholic Near East Welfare Association by making recommendations to the United Nations on June 5, 1947 and by a "real protest" on August 20, 1948. With the exception of communism and Soviet persecutions behind the Bamboo and Iron curtains, Monsignor McMahon said there has been no other subject on which the Holy Father has been more outspoken than on the Palestine question. The Monsignor recalled that the Pope has written three Encyclicals and one memorandum demanding a just settlement of the situation. Monsignor McMahon also said that in November a strongly worded article, emphasizing that the Vatican had not changed its position on Palestine, appeared in the Osservatore Romano, which he described as a "semi-official organ of the Vatican." "If anything more were needed," Monsignor McMahon said, "God knows what could dispel the propaganda campaign of the past three years to the effect that the Vatican would settle for much less and that the demands of the Pope that the United Nations respect its solution and its plighted votes for Palestine could be easily satisfied by compromise on the part of the Vatican." "While the fight of the Church there was another propaganda trend to the effect that the Vatican had made overtures to Israel, but added it "should be very much squelched by now."

than and Catholic rights be respected in Palestine," Monsignor McMahon said. "The State of Israel, through its press, its pamphlets and by means of men who really should have been representing other countries, has willingly lent itself to giving the impression that the Vatican was seeking an accord with Israel, at ways with the understanding that said accord would involve a compromise in favor of Israel's present stand." "Monsignor McMahon emphasized: "No Vatican diplomat has ever approached Israel on the subject."
