

Beria Asked For Bible Before Death

Dublin - (NC) - The Standard reports that L. P. Beria, executed former Russian deputy pre mier, asked for a copy of the New Testament during his imprisonment in a Moscow jail.

The paper states that this news was brought to Berlin by Professor P. Yudin, described as former director of the Cominform Bu ceau in Bucharest and later Soviet Deputy High Commissioner in Eastern Germany.

THE STANDARD says that Beria asked for a copy of the New Testament in Georgian, his native language. It adds that the former Soviet official had read the New Testament as a young boy. The Standard story does not say whether Soviet prison officials compiled with the Berla re-

The Standard had earlier print ed a story that His Eminence Stefan Cardinal Wyszynski, the Primate of Poland, was held in Moscow's_Liublanka prison in a cell next to that of Beria. The Standard's current story states that the Cardinal spent in prayer the day


