As a weekly reminder of Mary's Year, Rev. Hubert A. Bisky, Pastor of St. Peter and Paul's Church, Elmira, announces that the Official Marian Year Prayer, composed by the Holy Father, will be added to the Sunday afternoon Benediction Service at 5 p.m.

Those conditions are: Confession, Holy Communion, prayers for the Holy Father's intention, and a visit to any Church. (The visit to a special Church dedicated to Our Lady is required only on certain Feasts which will be published, Father Bisky says, in the current issue of the Parish Chimes.)

A Partial Indulgence of five years may be gained every time it is recited devoutly with a contrite heart on a day other than Saturday, or for a second or third time on Saturdays.

To increase devotion to Our Lady during Her Year, the pamphlet entitled "The Marian Year" will be placed on the Pamphlet Stand. This pamphlet contains the Encyclical Letter of Pope Pius XII, the Official Prayer, and the Indulgences to be gained.

## Inquiry Classes Listed At St. Patrick's, Elmira

Arrangements have been completed to conduct an Inquiry Class each Tuesday and Friday evenings starting Jan. 26 and continuing until April 23, according to the Rt. Rev. Msgr. William J. Brien, V.F., pastor of St. Patrick's church, Elmira.

The classes will be held at 7:30 p.m. in St. Patrick's school for the purpose of discussing the fundamentals of Catholic Truths and to give a positive picture of the Catholic Church.

LECTURES WILL be non-controversial and aimed at dispelling any false ideas about Catholic belief or practices. They will be aimed to the intellect, not the emotions and will be designed to present the intellectual basis for Catholicism and not to foster prejudices, Monsignor Brien said.

The classes will last for one hour and will be held primarily for non-Catholics but Catholics are invited to accompany their non-Catholic friends or relatives.

At the conclusion of the class, a question period will be conducted with questions being asked from the floor or being answered from the question box that will be made available.

Informative pamphlets on the topics to be discussed will be distributed to those in attendance.

The classes will be conducted by Rev. Frederick W. Bush and Rev. Robert J. Donovan, assistant pastors of the parish.
