#### General Franco Awarded Highest Papal Decoration

Madrid - (NC) - Archishop Ildebrando Antoniútti, new Papal\_Nuncio to Spain, presented his credentials to General Francisco Franco, the Spanish chief of state, at the national palace

. At the same time the Archbishop informed the General that Pope Pius XII had 'conferred on him the Supreme Orler of Christ, highest papal decoration for laymen and reserved for singular services to the Church.

Bestowal of this honor on General Franco, marks only he second time that Pope Pius XII has conferred it in his 15year pontificate. The other recipient was Prince Francesco Chigi, late commander of the Noble Guard, who received the decoration in December 1939. The prince died on July 2 of this year.

The Supreme Order of Christ was instituted by Pope John XXII in 1319 and derived from a Portuguese military order. The uniform of the order is a scarlet coat with white breeches and stockings.
