New York—Three million volunteers—the largest number in the history of the National Foundation for Infantile Paralysis—have swelled the ranks of polio fighters taking part in the 1954 March of Dimes campaign for \$75,000,000. It was disclosed here today.

Joseph F. Nee, fund raising director of the March of Dimes organization, said the mammoth polio prevention drive was being carried on in every city and town in the United States and its territories.

More than a million of the volunteers taking part in the campaign this month are women who will participate in the Mothers' March on Polio during the last week of the drive. Another highlight of the campaign is a "Statehood" fund raising contest between the territories of Alaska and Hawaii.
