His Eminence Jules Cardinal Sallege, Archbishop of Toulouse, speaking to the priests of his liocese, emphasized the strict duty of Catholics to submit faithfully to the directions of the Rope and to guard against intellectual pride.

THE CARDINAL asked his priests to meditate on the example of Father de Lubac, one of whose books was refused the approval of Church authorities. "Father de Lubac could have sulked," the Cardinal noted. "He could have kept silent. What did he do? He wrote an admirable book on Holy Mother Church."
