Selling Essay Contest To Open In 12 Schools

Students at Aquinas Institute as well as those in nine public high schools, Brighton and Irondequoit High Schools will participate in an Essay Contest from Feb. 8 to Feb. 27.

The contest is part of a national program and the objective is to encourage American youth to explore the desirability of selling as a career. The theme is "Why You Would Prefer Selling As A Career." Essays are not to exceed a thousand words. Juniors and seniors of the 12 schools will be eligible.

The Rochester Board of Education and the principals of Aquinas Institute, Brighton and Irondequoit High Schools have sponsored the project as a means of acquainting young people with the importance of the selling function in our economic system.

Reference books on selling will be supplied each school and competing students will be briefed the first week in February by Club members who will instruct participants on the rules and purpose of the contest.

HAROLD COLEMAN and Tom Mooney will serve as contest advisors at Aquinas Institute. Other advisors are: Brighton, Howard Kalbous and Frank McConville; Irondequoit, Lysie McKelvey and Gerold Wunderlich; John Marshall, Bruce Paschal, Robert Tucker; East High, Willard Dinnis, George Hehner; West High, Gilbert Owen, Walter McKie; Benjamin Franklin, Robert Skerritt, Peter Prozzeller; Madison, Harold Miller, Herbert Mossion; Monroe, Merrell Du Bois, Norman Miller; Charlotte, Leonard Thomasina, Lloyd Cox, Jefferson, Richard Reddington and Joseph Allendorf; Edison Tech, Roy Marks and George Stewart.

Principals and vocational guidance counselors will select 40 to 60 students from each school to compete. To the first, second and third-place winners in each school, prizes of \$25, \$15 and a certificate will be awarded.

First, second and third-place winners of the Rochester area contest will be awarded \$75, \$50 and \$25 respectively.

WINNING ESSAYS of the Rochester area contest will be submitted to the National Sales Executives for judging in the nationwide contest. National winners will be awarded \$1000 with all expenses paid to the Annual NSE Conference in June in Chicago. The principal or teacher sponsoring the first-place winner receives \$200 and expenses to
