

Hornell District DCCW Lists Father Coonan Talk

Hornell — The Rev. John L. Coonan of Rochester, former assistant pastor of St. Ann's Church, will be principal speaker at a First Saturday luncheon, Feb. 6 at 12:15 p.m. in the Moose Home.

Plans for the luncheon were made last evening at a regular meeting of Hornell District, Diocese Council of Catholic Women. The Rev. Robert MacNamara, spiritual director, was advisory chairman of the meeting. Miss Virginia Hussong, district president, conducted the business session.

Father Coonan, now Vice Chancellor of the Diocese of Rochester, who was the first spiritual advisor of the Hornell District DCCW, will speak on a phase of the Marian Year and its implications for an increase of devotion to the Blessed Virgin Mary.

Saturday's luncheon is the fifth in this year's series sponsored by Hornell District of the DCCW in honor of Our Lady of Fatima. Representatives from five affiliated Catholic women's organizations attended last night's meeting in the Pine Room of St. Ann's School.

Third Order Rules Explained

Hornell's special, extraordinary symbol of piety, the Third Order is primarily a Order of Penance. Its aim is humility and with no sense of self-glorification.

WHEN A SINGLE group becomes a fraternity of the Third Order in any city or town that group acts as a leaven spreading to all parishes and operating as a training school to that end.

Benedict XV wrote: "For sanctity is incompatible with any mode or walk of life—it follows of necessity, that where a number of people live in keeping with the Rule, they will be a powerful incentive to all their neighbors, not only to comply with every detail of duty but to aspire to a more perfect aim in life than the general law requires."

The Third Order, Secular of St. Francis is a true order and its members, in a wide, sense, truly religious. It is true that Tertians strive toward Christian perfection in the spirit of St. Francis—they do penance for their sins and the sins of the world. But they do rise above human misery to cheerfully rejoice in the mercy, grace and beneficence of God. They earnestly try to be poor in spirit, humble of heart, patient in trouble and contented in the loving care of their heavenly Father.

POPE LEO XIII said: "You need not quit society and family, or your earthly possessions. There is no special vow exacted. True liberty is not curtailed in the least. The scope of the Third Order is simply this, to keep society clean from the corruption of the world by sanctifying the ordinary and even the most trifling actions in the spirit of Jesus Christ."

POPE PIUS XI called the Third Order the soul of Catholic Action. It helps a person toward real success. Every Catholic owes it to himself, to his loved ones and to his Church to give it a fair trial.

Waverly — Rev. G. Stuart Hogan, pastor of St. James Church, began on Sunday to receive registrations for the 1954-55 school year from parents who will have children in the first three grades.

Father Hogan reported that the school will be open with the first three grades in September of 1954, but the present third grade is also being registered should it become possible to accommodate a fourth-grade as well.

There will be no tuition charged for children of the church, but those outside the parish will pay a small rate of tuition comparable to the cost of educating a child of the parish, Father Hogan said.
