The Catholic Evidence Library (in Columbus Civic Center) provides an opportunity to all who wish to accept this challenge. To learn the truth about people and about their lives, it is possible to glean knowledge from well over 1500 volumes arranged upon the shelves. These cover such topics as Communism, Biography, Family Life, Education, History, Travel, Philosophy and Theology.

THE WORKS of fiction and non-fiction are from the pens of eminent writers and in the current issues of the magazines are to be found discussions of today's trends and events interpreted and analyzed in the light of Catholic philosophy. On the magazine rack are copies of America, The Sign, Integrity, World, The Catholic Mind, The Messenger of The Sacred Heart, The Commonweal and other magazines. Also are displayed the Catholic Courier Journal and The Register.

During Catholic Press month drop into the library on the first floor of the Columbus Civic Center and browse around. You will be very welcome. Library hours, Monday through Friday, are from 11 a.m. to 4 p.m., and from 7 p.m. to 9 p.m. on Saturday, from 11 a.m. to 4 p.m. only.
