110 Aides Presented Service Chevrons By Sister Martina In Hospital Program

Recognition of the past year's service on the part of 110 of the more than 250 volunteer aides at St. Mary's Hospital took place Saturday afternoon when Sister Martina, hospital administrator, presented chevrons, symbols of the service.

Highlighting the program held in the auditorium of the Nurses Home was presentation of a Spiritual Bouquet to Sister Martina by the aides to mark her Feast Day, Jan. 30.

Mrs. George A. Heitz, chairman of the Women's Board presented at the meeting at which the Rev. Paul C. Wohlrab, newly appointed chaplain at the hospital, was presented.

MORE THAN 17,000 hours were given by the 110 aides, the workers in the Marillac Gift Shop, the Sisters' Alumni service and Girl Scouts. The aides were feted at a tea by the hospital following the meeting.

The aides appeared in their cherry red uniforms which were adopted by St. Mary's a year ago to conform with the official uniform recommended by the Women's Auxiliary of the American Hospital Association.
