THE Zulus once the most warlike of all African tribes are per haps the one people in the world who most welcome death. When missionaries amoint them on deathbeds, they ask for prayers that they may die, When asked: "Don't you want to live?" Their answer is: "My faith tells me I shall be happy with God when I die. Why should I want to be away from perfect happiness?" Their attitude is something like St. Paul who said: "I deserve to be dissolved, to be with Christ." The uncertainty of judgment is one reason why we are so reluctant to die, but the Zulu trust in God's mercy is so great it makes him fearless of Divine Judgment,

Another African people, the Kikuyus, will never offer of give gift with one hand. To them, one-handled giving signifies only half the heart. When they receive Communion, they stretch out both hands to indicate their total self-oblation. 
