**Commodore Barry Dinner
Scheduled By Hibernians**

Sixth Annual Commodore John Barry Banquet in Hotel Seneca on Wednesday, Feb. 24 will have as principal speaker, the Rev. Dr. Edward Lodge Curran of Brooklyn. Speakers will have the approval by President Eisenhower of an appropriation of \$30,000 for a statue of Commodore Barry to be erected in County Wexford, Ireland, Barry's birthplace.

This is announced by Monroe County Board Ancient Order of Hibernians and Ladies Auxiliary sponsoring the banquet and organizers of the idea of paying tribute to Commodore Barry. Revolutionary war U. S. Navy hero.

FATHER CURRAN who addressed the first Barry Banquet in 1939 is president of the International Catholic Truth Society, a nationally known orator and one of the leading opponents of Communism in America. He is chairman of the National Irish Anti-Fascist Movement.

He is a former New York State Chaplain of the Ancient Order of Hibernians, and the Knights of Columbus and a member of the Catholic Lawyers Guild.
